


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# CEA 2020 VIRTUAL SUMMER EXPERIENCE

## SESSIONS

### **Best Practices for Virtual Learning (K-5)**

Teaching in a distance learning model is new and difficult. This teacher-led session will cover best practices for virtual learning, and include strategies for maintaining student engagement, as well as tips on designing interesting virtual lessons.

### **Best Practices for Virtual Learning (Middle/HS)**

Teaching in a distance learning model is new and difficult. This teacher-led session will cover best practices for virtual learning including strategies for maintaining student engagement as well as tips on designing interesting virtual lessons.

### **How to Engage Students in Conversations About Race (K-5)**

Talking about race and racism in the classroom can be challenging but is necessary and can't be ignored. This teacher-led session will offer insights and ideas on how to tackle these sensitive conversations.

### **How to Engage Students in Conversations About Race (Middle/HS)**

This presentation will be a workshop format. Participants will be presented with key strategies on how to take part in conversations about race with secondary level students. Members will practice using these strategies by role playing scenarios that may happen in a middle or high school. Educators will also be able to reflect on where they are in their journey regarding conversations about race.

### **Member Engagement in a Virtual World**

Teaching from home presents difficulties in staying connected to our members. In this session, CEA Organizers will discuss different ways for Association leaders to remain engaged with members remotely.

### **Signing Up New Hires**

Many districts will be conducting new teacher orientations in a virtual environment. This session will discuss strategies and best practices to help you sign new hires to membership under difficult circumstances.

### **Teacher Rights and Responsibilities in a Virtual Teaching Environment**

Even though teachers are becoming more accustomed to distance learning, many are unsure about their legal rights in a virtual teaching environment. A CEA attorney and a CEA educational issues specialist will discuss rights and responsibilities with regard to providing remote instruction; obligations to report; First Amendment; maintaining social media privacy settings on sites such as Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, and TikTok; and social media best practices.

### **Treasurers/Membership Chairs Training**

Local Association leaders are essential to the success of our union. This workshop will focus on topics such as membership processing requirements and how to properly handle your financial records and collect dues.
