n = 15,882 members

Conducted July 13-20, 2020 via Qualtrics

Margin of error = +/- 0.8 percentage points

- CEA members are divided between wanting to continue distance learning and taking a hybrid approach in the fall. Very few support full reopening.
- Members widely oppose Governor Lamont's plan and do not feel comfortable returning to school under the plan.
- Educators want many safety precautions in place before returning to school, including disinfecting and cleaning, masks, and social distancing, but they are also concerned about students' ability to consistently wear masks and socially distance.

- Most members see distance learning as “somewhat” effective so far.
- Educators working with students with disabilities face particular problems distance learning.

How effective do you think distance learning was for your students?

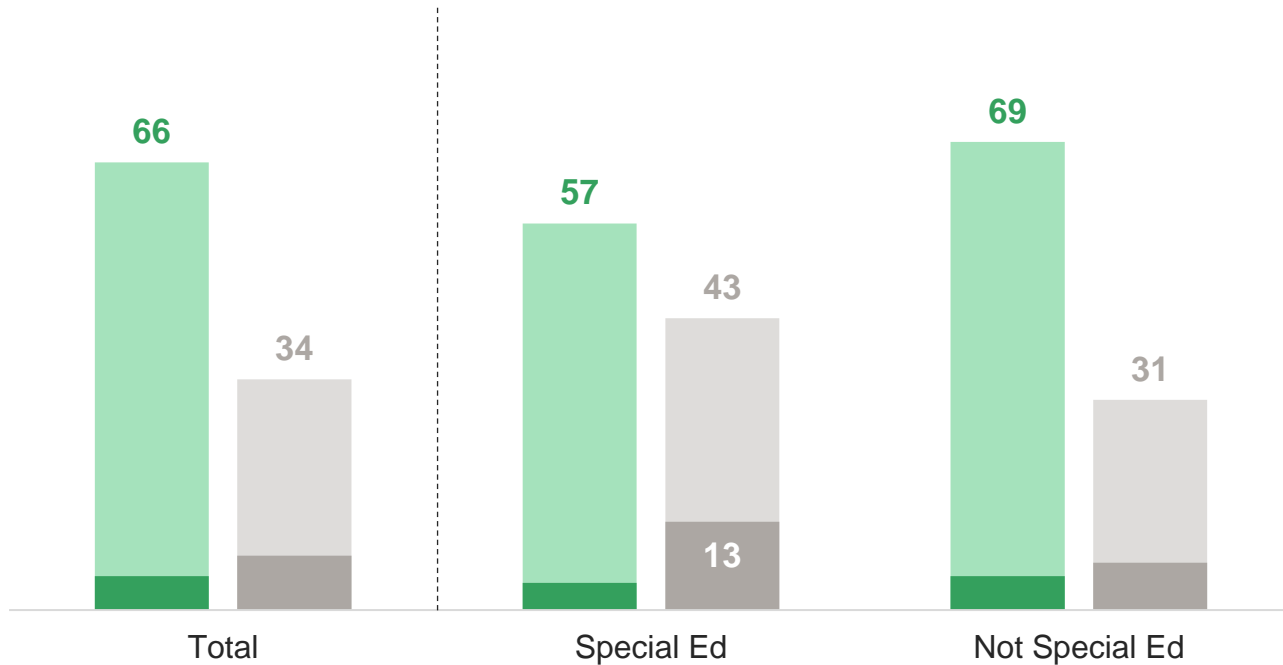

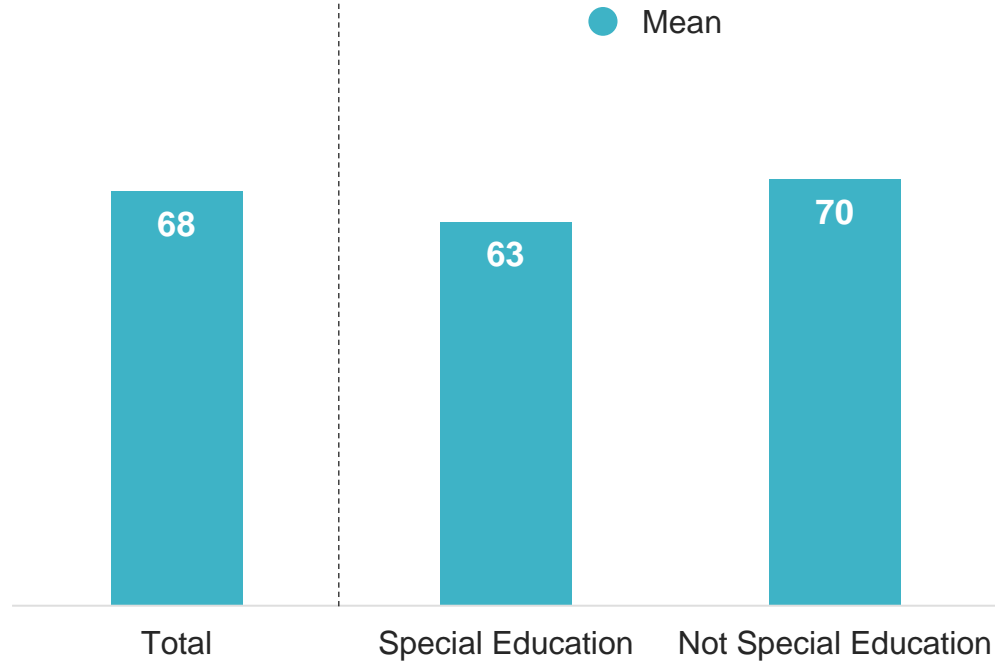


Attendance Lower Among Special Education Students

In terms of class attendance and participation, about what percentage of your students regularly attended or participated in distance or digital learning opportunities during the shutdown this spring? Give your best estimate.

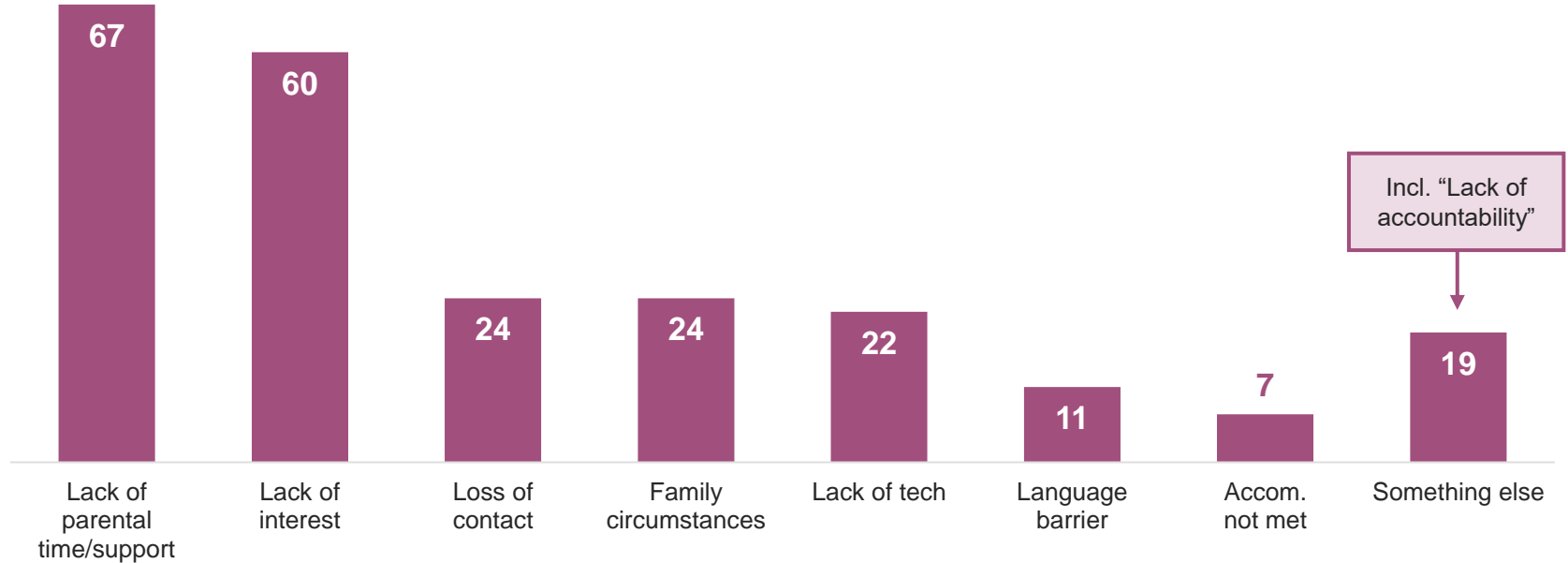


Lack Of Parental Time/Support, Student Interest Most Frequently Cited Reasons For Participation Problems

Lack Of Participation

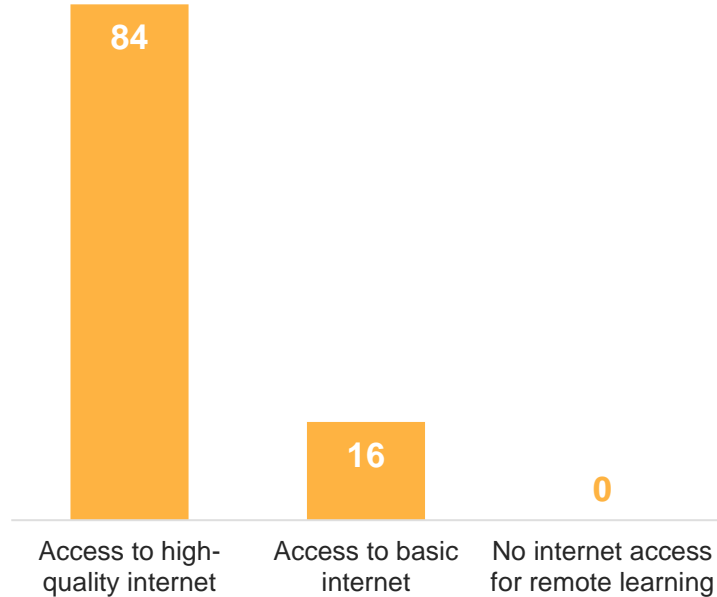

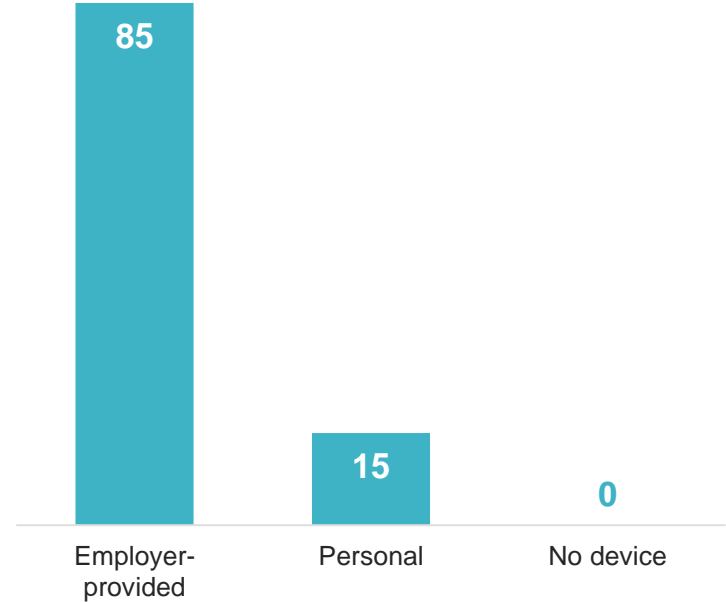

Member Devices

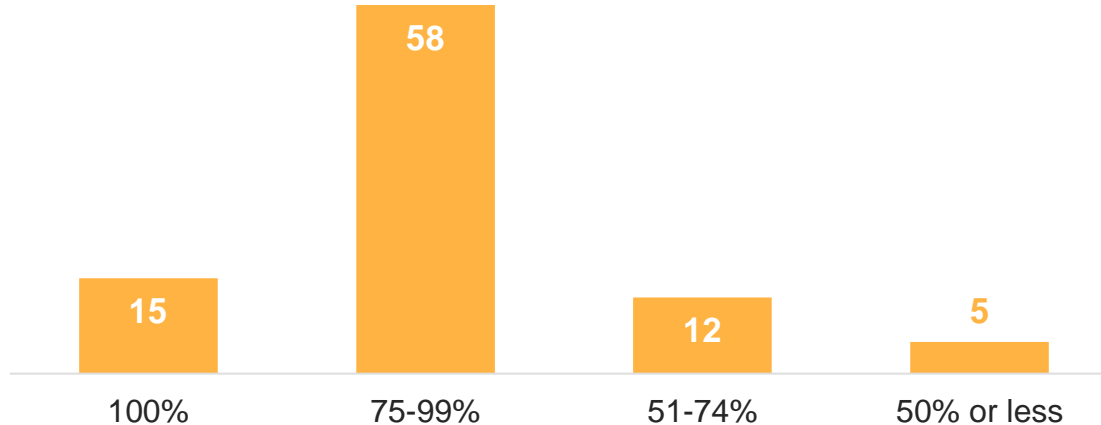


Most Members Report Majority, But Not All, Students Had Reliable Internet

To the best of your knowledge, what percentage of your students had consistent and reliable access to appropriate internet and technological devices for distance learning in the spring? Give your best estimate.

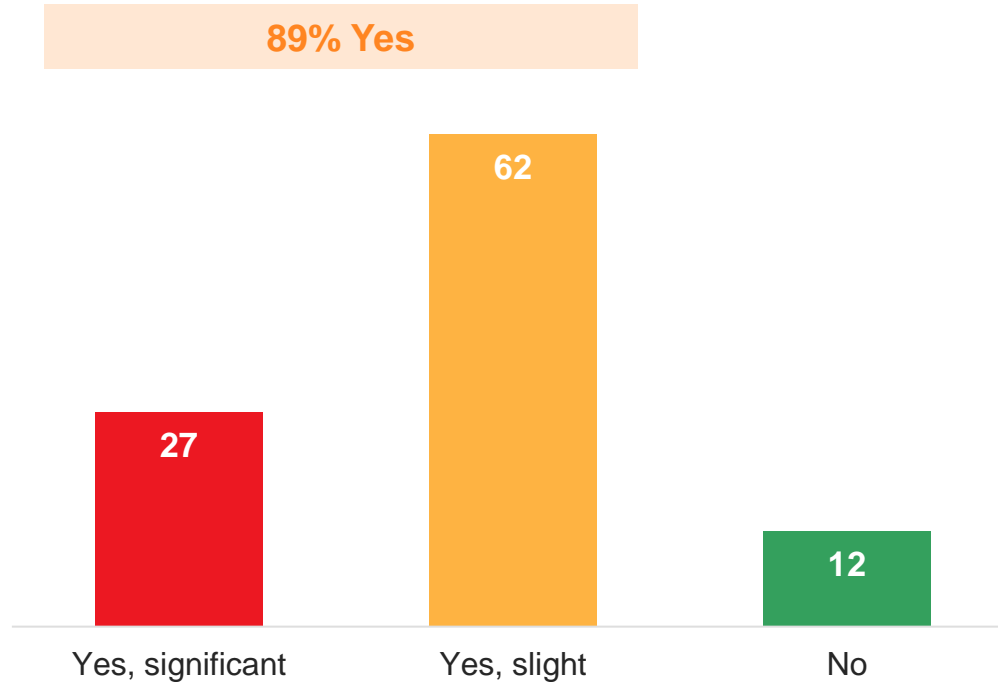


Concerns About Learning Loss During Distance Education

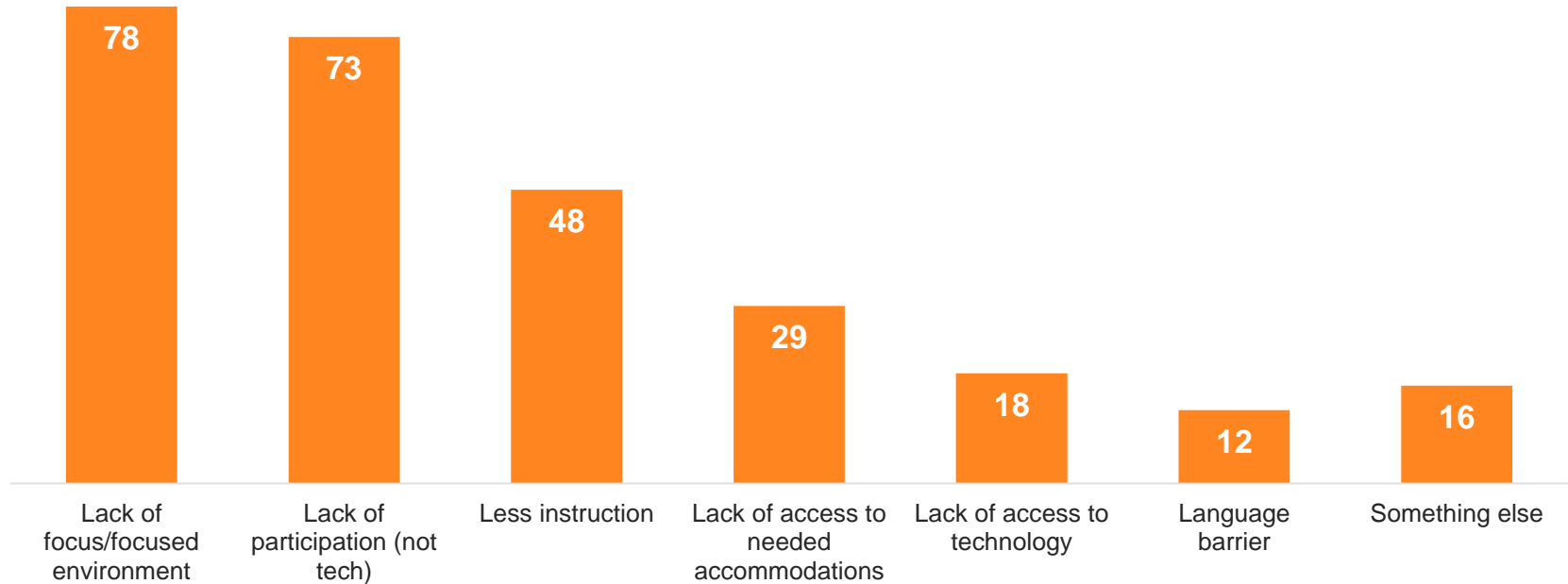
Learning Loss

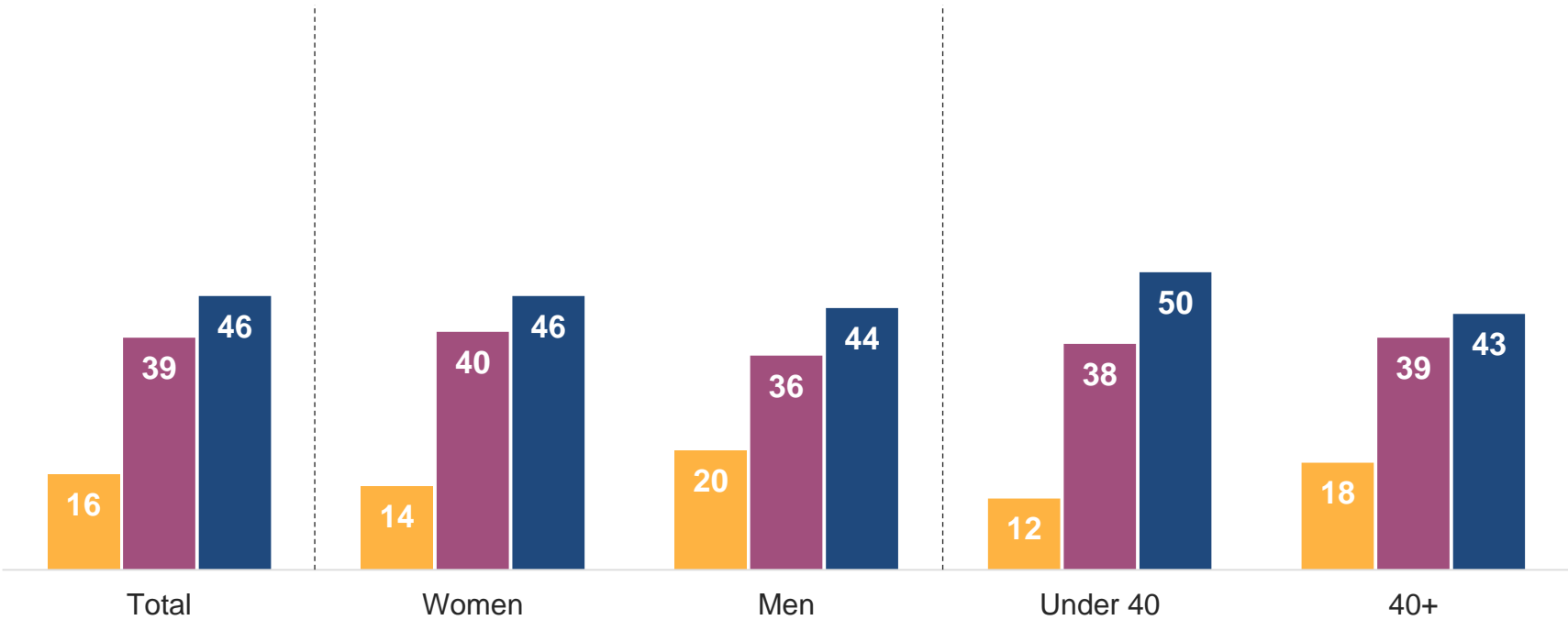

Based on current trends, if you were given a choice, would you rather...?

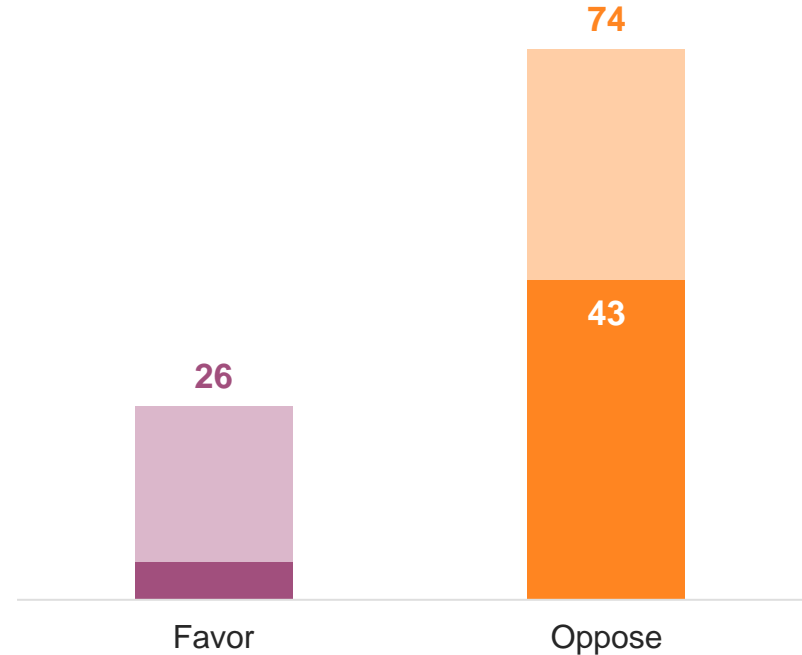

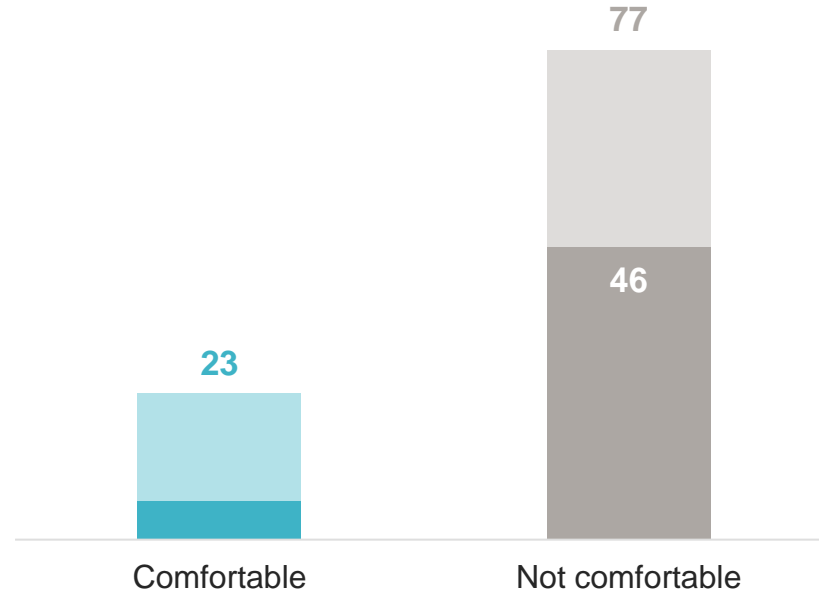
Most Members Uncomfortable Returning Under Lamont Plan

Based on the state's plan, how comfortable are you returning to physical school in the fall?

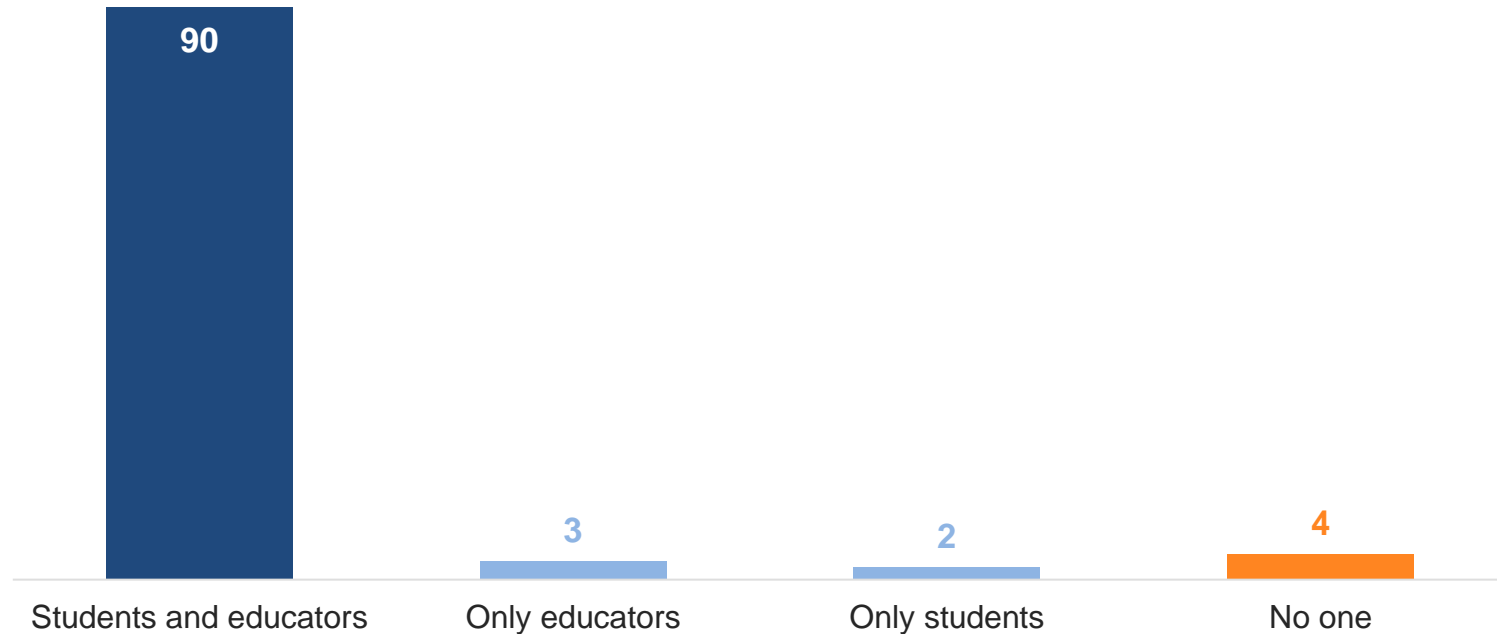

When it comes to policies regarding wearing masks in school during the coronavirus pandemic, do you think _____ should be required to wear masks?

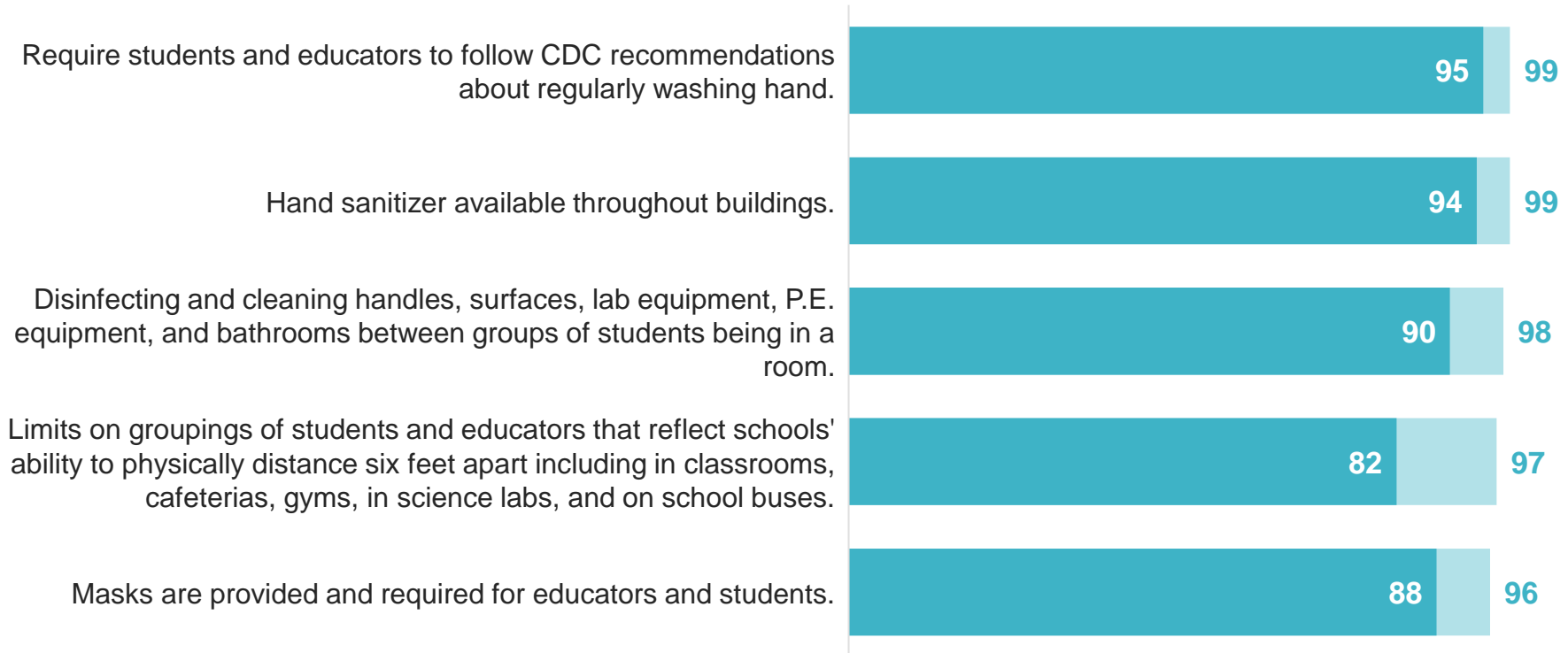


Large Majorities Think All Proposed Reopening Precautions Are “Very Important”

● Very important ● Total important

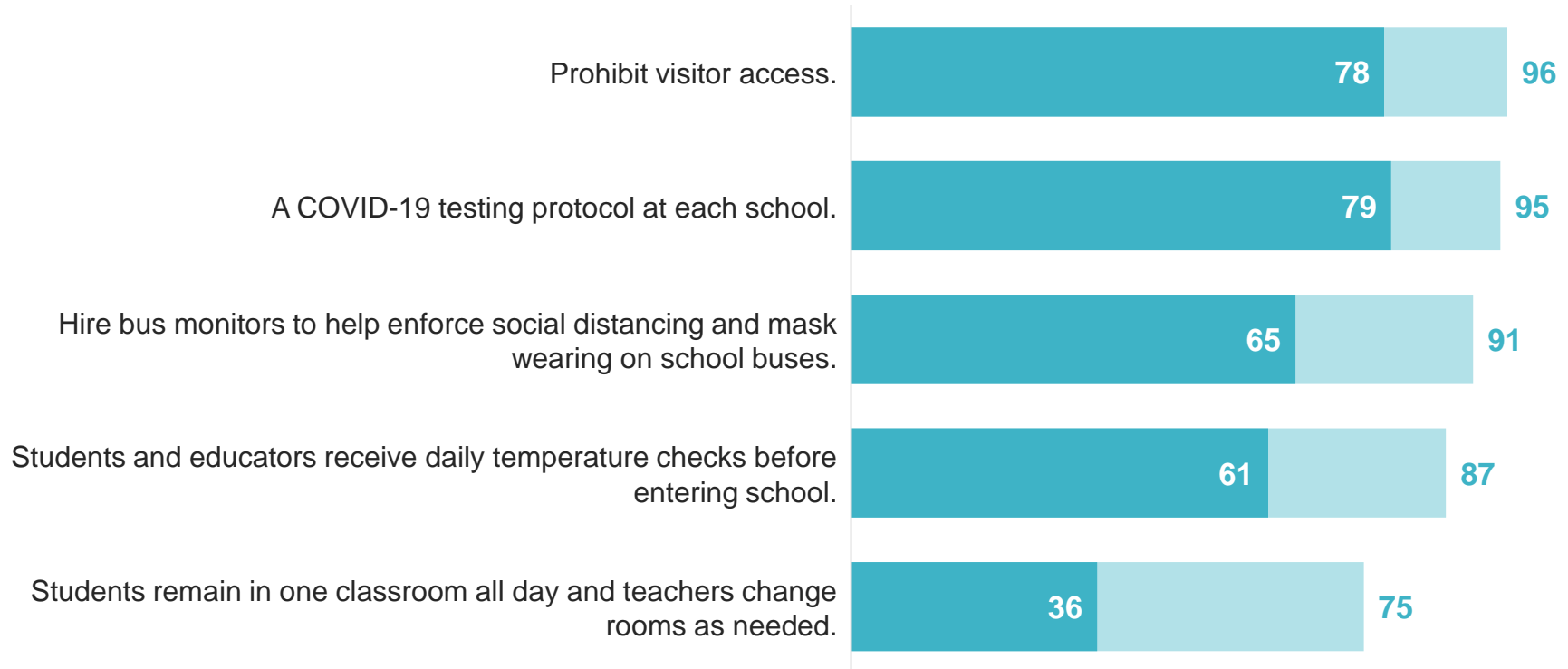


Members Place Less Importance On Teachers Changing Rooms, While Students Stay Put

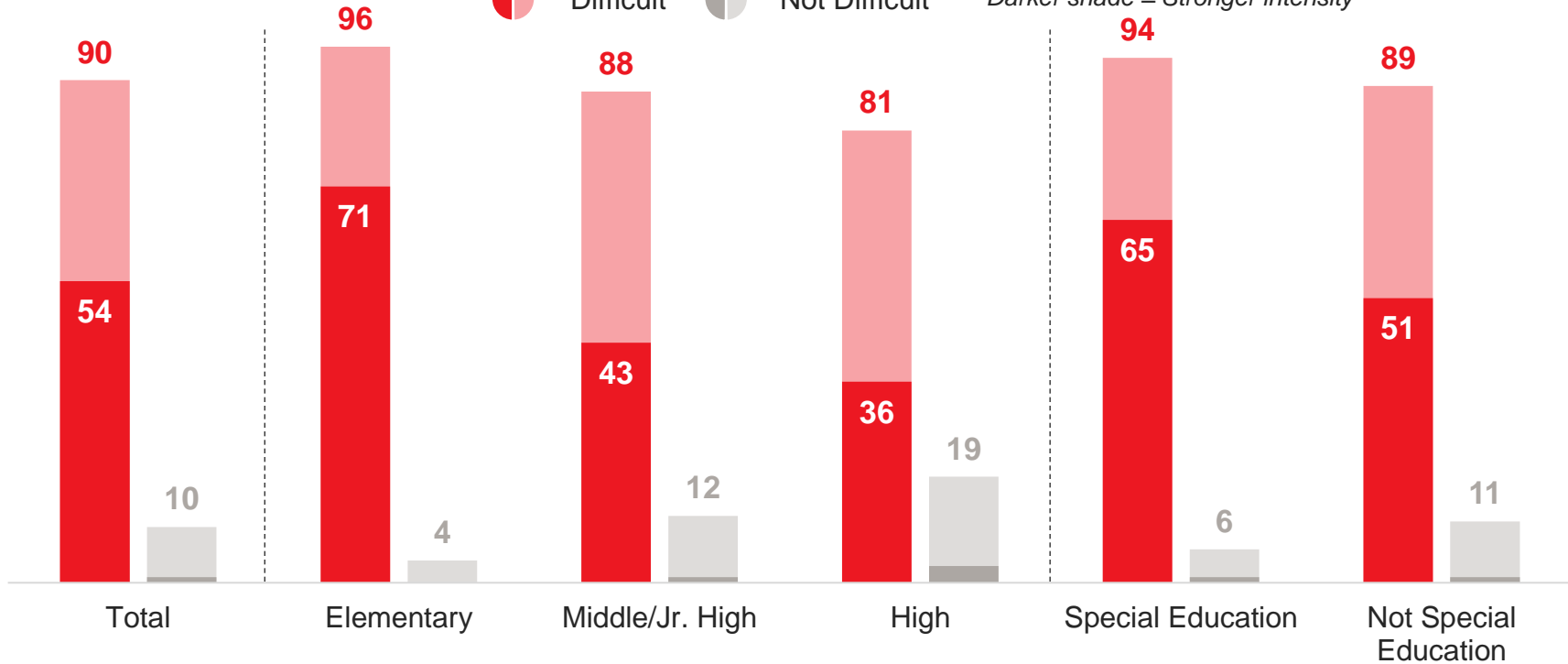

Thinking about the grade level(s) or students you work with, how difficult do you think it will be to implement social distancing and other health practices during the school day?

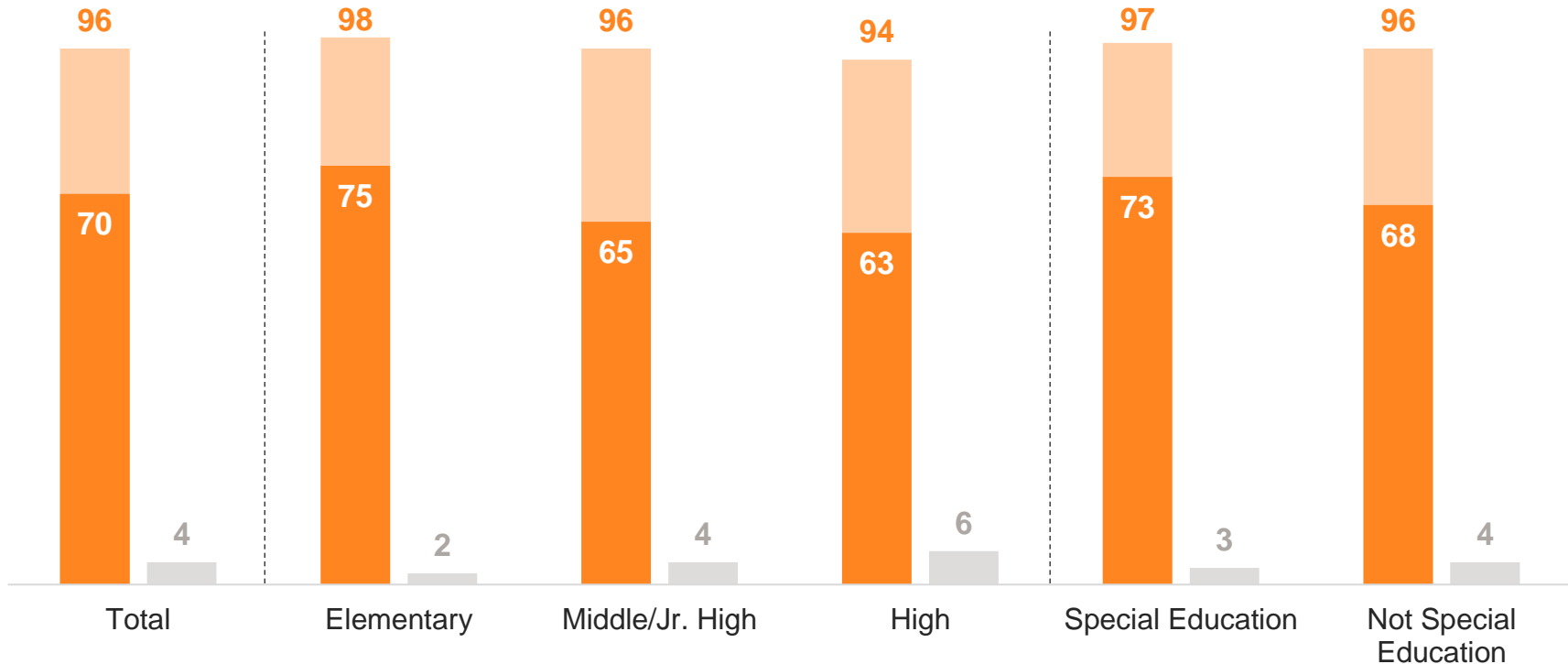

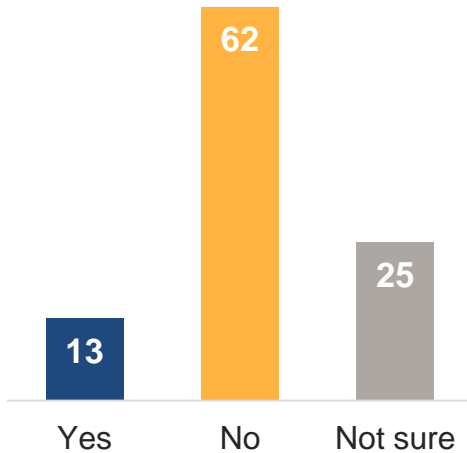

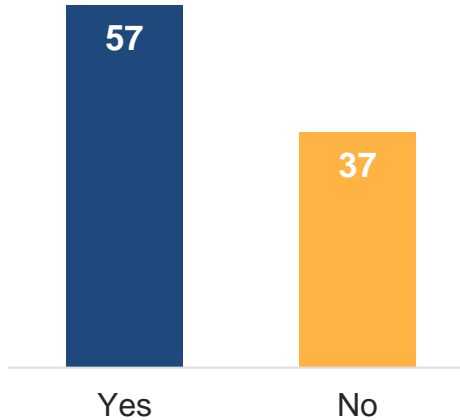
Mix Of Airflow In Schools And Classrooms

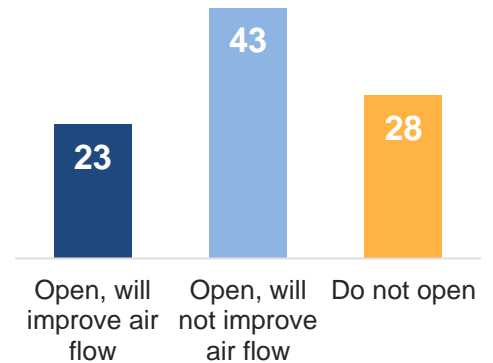
Air Flow In School

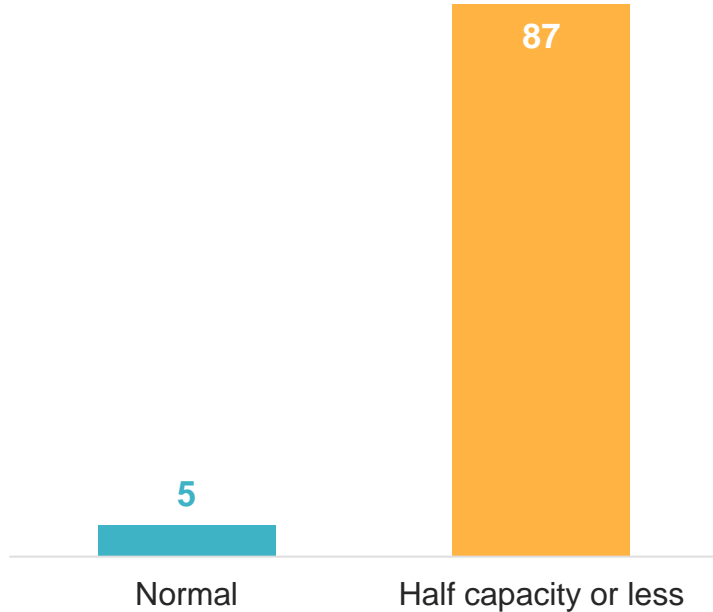

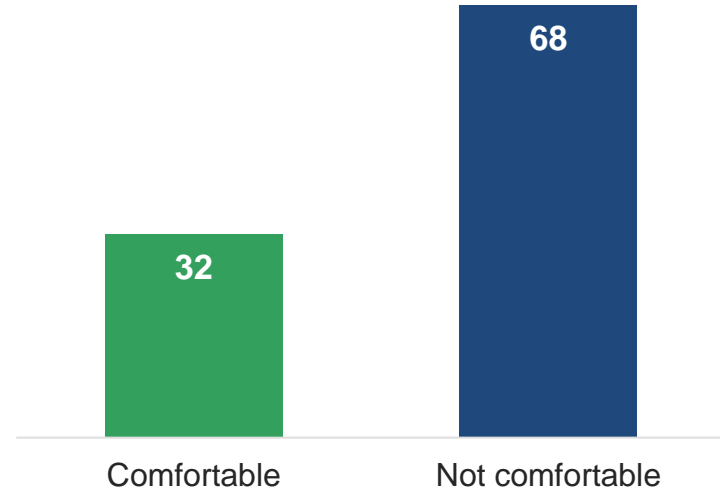
Members Think Buses Should Run At Lower Capacity, Most Uncomfortable Loading And Unloading

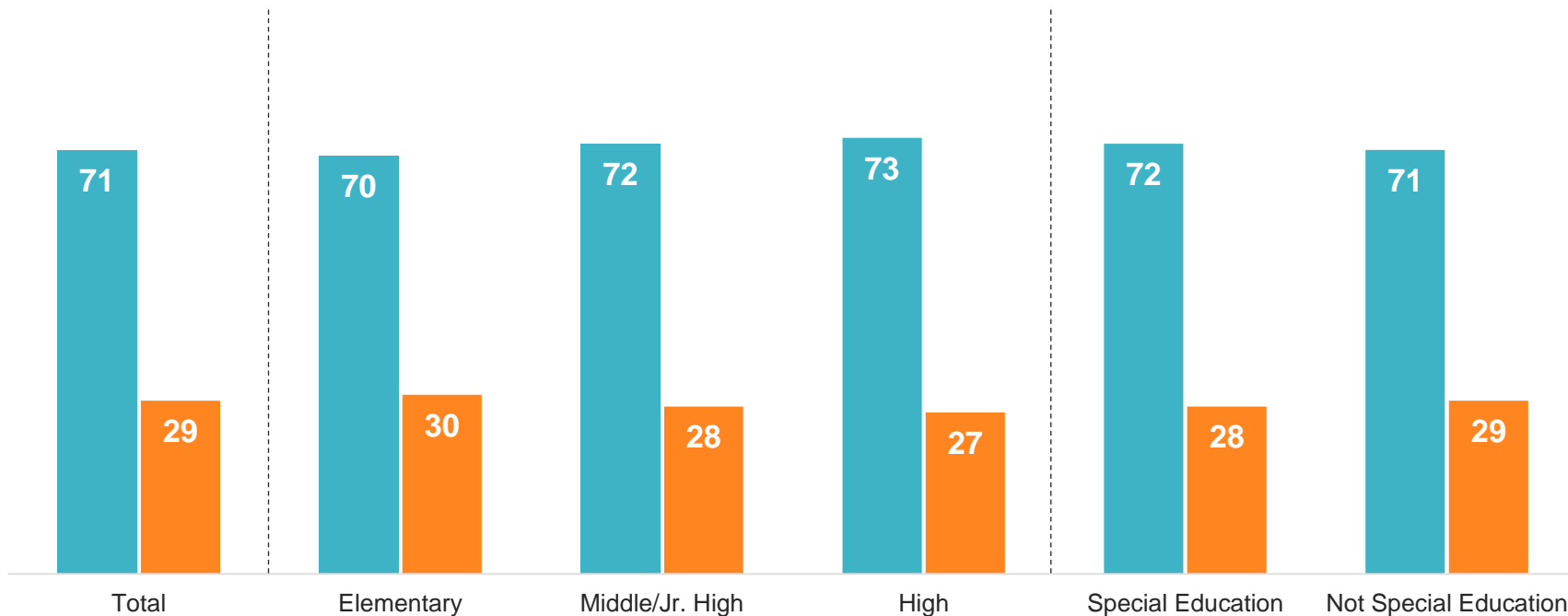

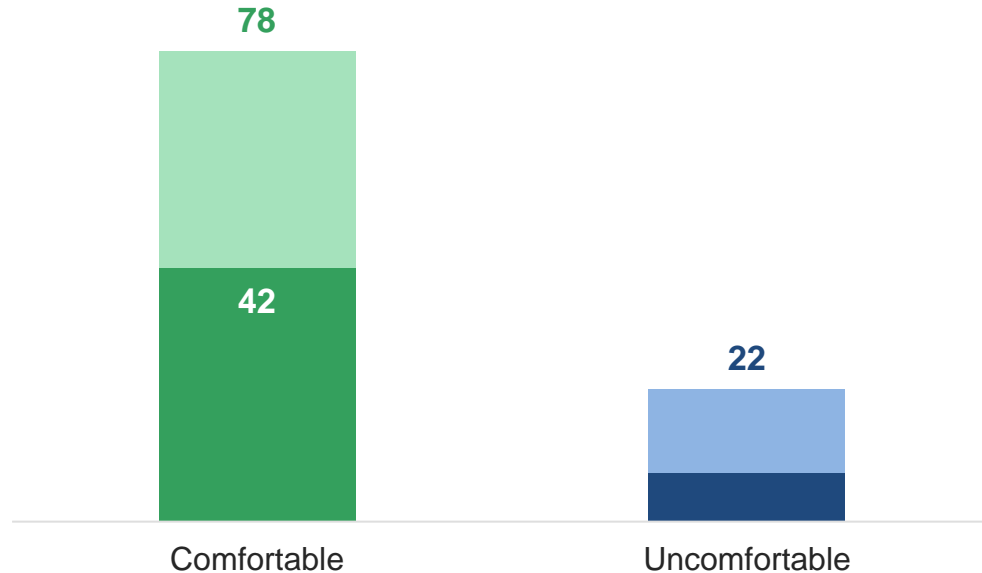
Most Would Be Comfortable With Contact Tracing Technology

Tracking Technology

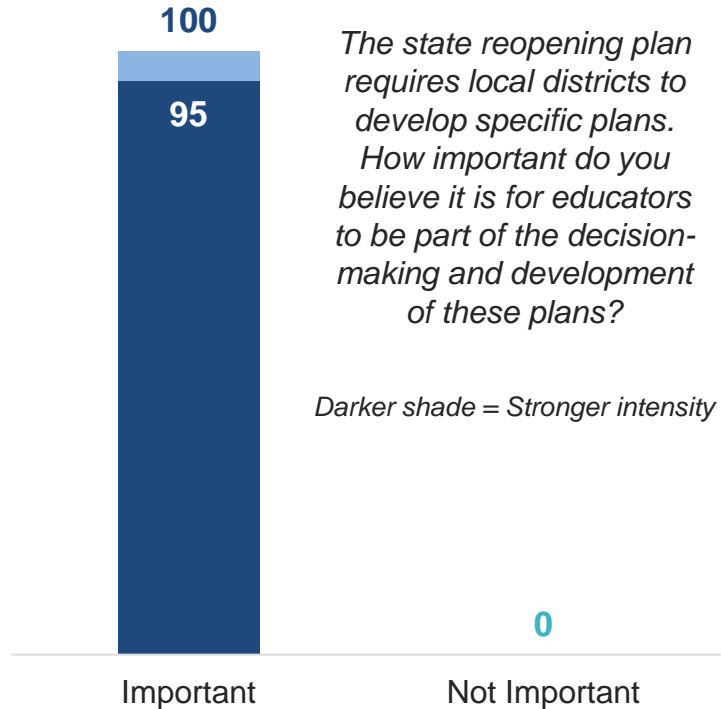
How comfortable would you be if your district used technology to track students and educators who have come into contact with someone with COVID-19?

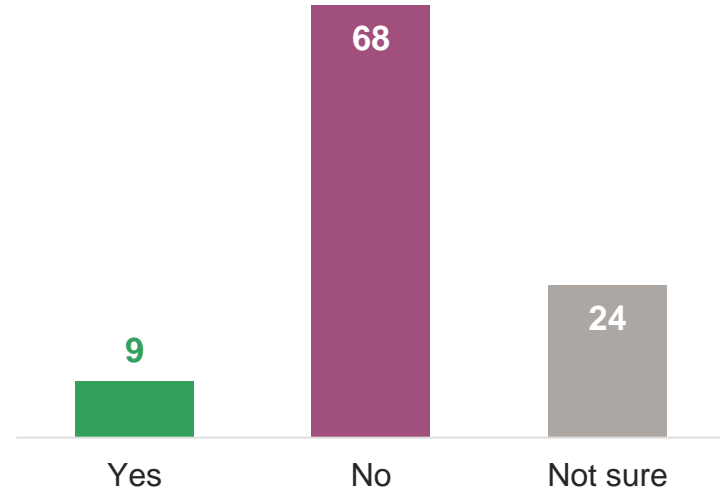
Unanimity That Educators Need To Be Part Of The Decision-Making Process

A Quarter Report Considering Leaving Education Earlier Than Planned

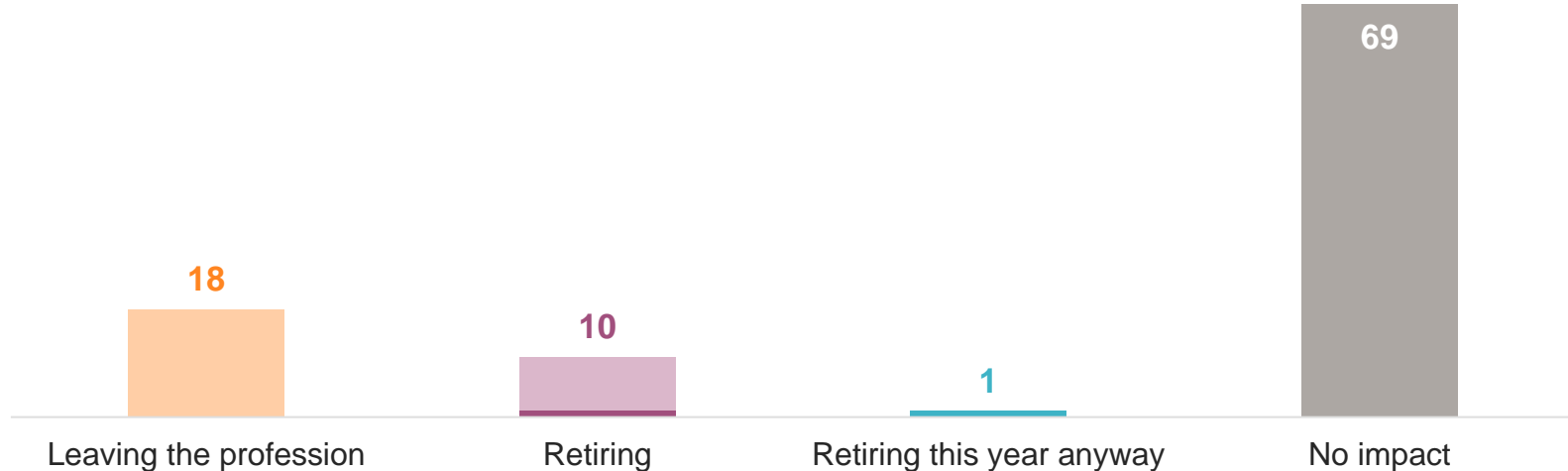

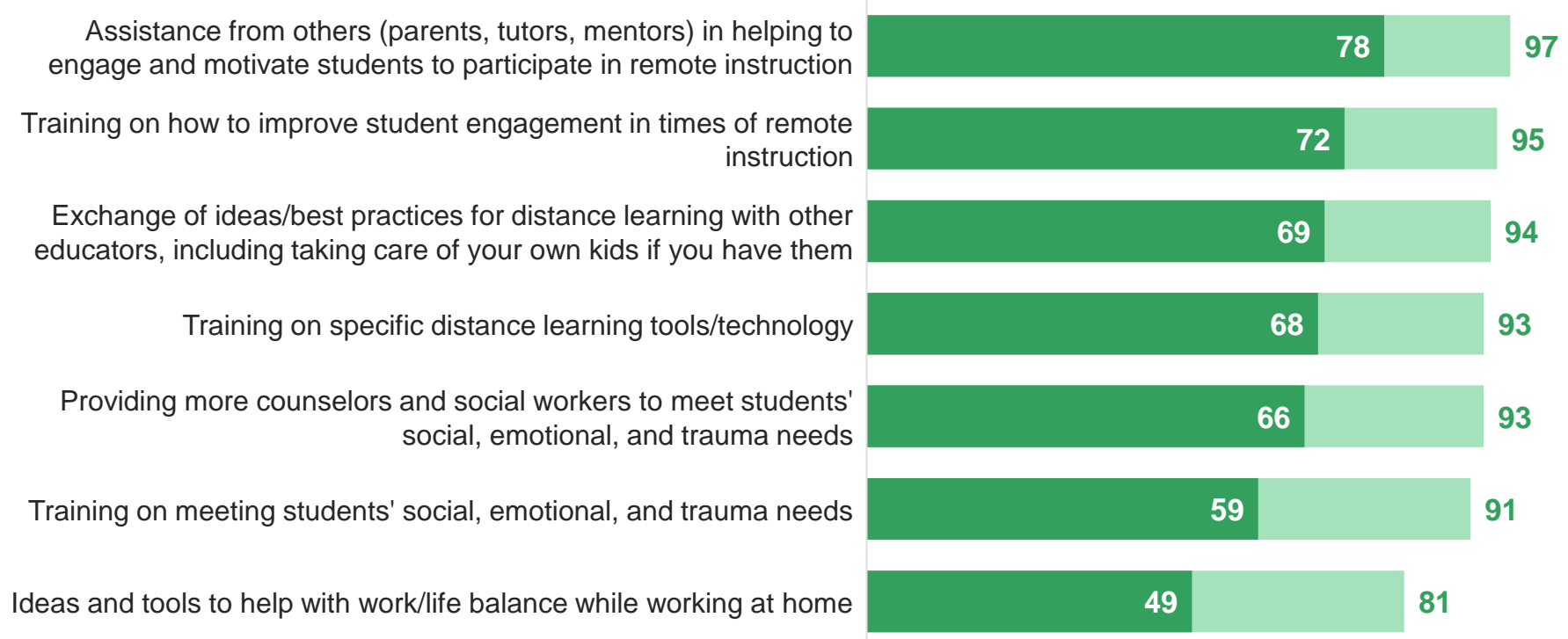
