




### Q2 In which grade level range do you primarily teach?









# Q11 Are there currently job openings for certified educators in your building?





# Q12 Based on your observation, approximately what percentage of certified positions have openings?





# Q13 Are there currently job openings for paraeducators and other uncertified support staff in your building?





# Q14 Based on your observation, approximately what percentage of paraeducator positions are open?





## Q15 Is your district's budget for the coming school year higher or lower than last year?





## Q16 Did your district lay off teachers or other school personnel this past year?











## Q25 On average, how much of your own money do you spend on classroom materials, supplies, and your students on a yearly basis?

















# Q36 Have you ever had to evacuate your classroom due to classroom disruptions that threaten the safety of students?








### Q39 What are the biggest challenges your students face? (Select all that apply)



# Q40 Is there sufficient support for students' mental health needs at your school building?





# Q41 Do you feel equipped to deal with your students' mental health challenges?





# Q42 In your opinion, are schools doing enough to properly handle incidents of bullying of students?





### Q43 Are you seeing an increase in bullying in your school?









#### Q47 Is your school district placing enough emphasis on students' socialemotional growth?





# Q48 Does your school district do enough to prepare students who do not intend to enroll in college to enter the workforce?





# Q49 Is indoor air temperature (extreme hot and cold, humidity, air quality, etc.) in your classroom/school building conducive to teaching and learning?




