

# 2019 TRUST Act



**The TRUST Act is Connecticut's  
'Sanctuary State' legislation.**

It restricts law enforcement from helping  
Immigrations and Customs Enforcement  
(ICE) or any federal immigration agents.

**BREAK THE PRISON TO  
DEPORTATION PIPELINE**

**The 2019 CT TRUST Act** applies to city and state police, court marshalls, bail commissioners, probation officers, and school police and security officers.

### **LAW ENFORCEMENT CANNOT:**

- ▶ Arrest you based on your immigration status unless they have a signed judicial warrant.
- ▶ Use their time or resources to help ICE agents.
- ▶ If you have been convicted of a Class A or B felony, you may not be protected by the 2019 TRUST Act.

### **IF YOU ARE IN CUSTODY, OFFICERS CANNOT:**

- ▶ Let ICE interview you.
- ▶ Share your personal information without your consent.
- ▶ Keep you in custody to transfer you to ICE.
- ▶ Tell ICE when you'll be released unless they get approval from the agency chief.
- ▶ If officers hold you for ICE, they must provide a copy of ICE's request and a written reason for why they complied.

### **REMEMBER, YOU HAVE RIGHTS!**

- ▶ You have the right to remain silent.
- ▶ Do not answer questions about where you're from, or how you came to the U.S., or your immigration status.
