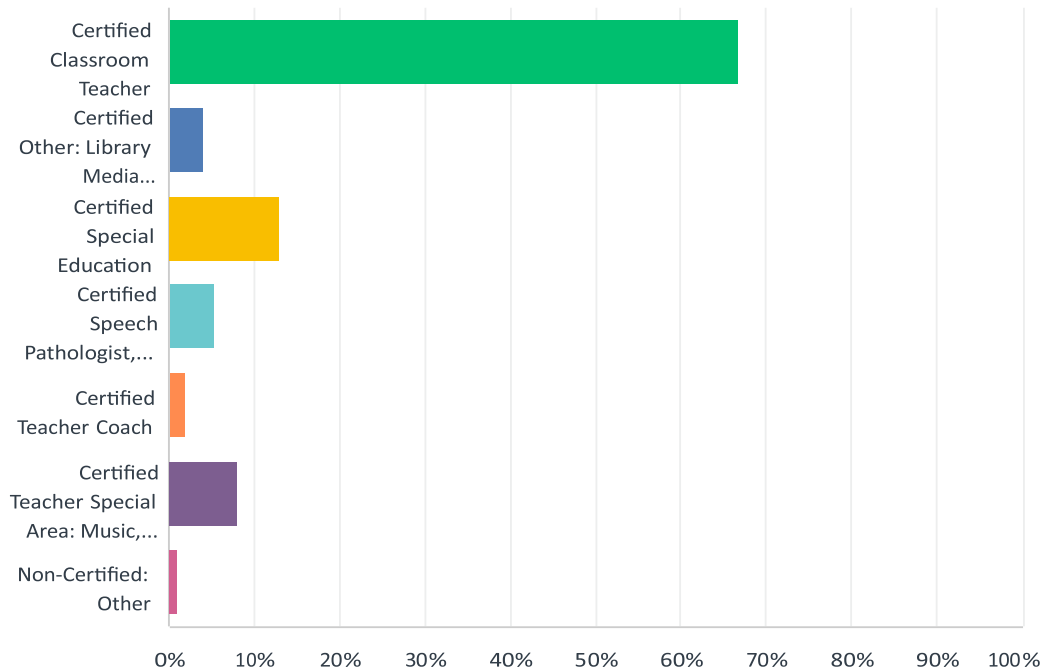

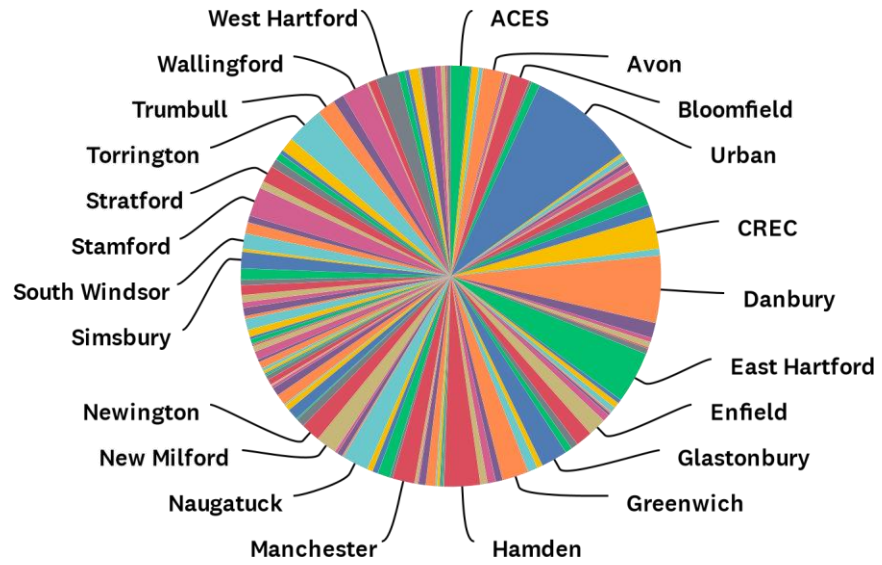

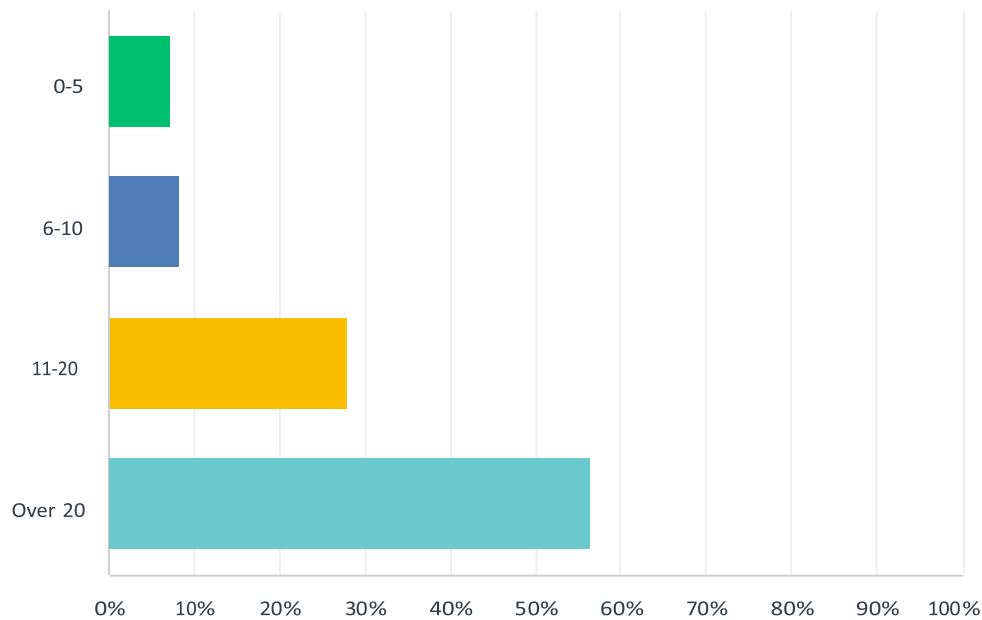

Q3 How many years have you been teaching?

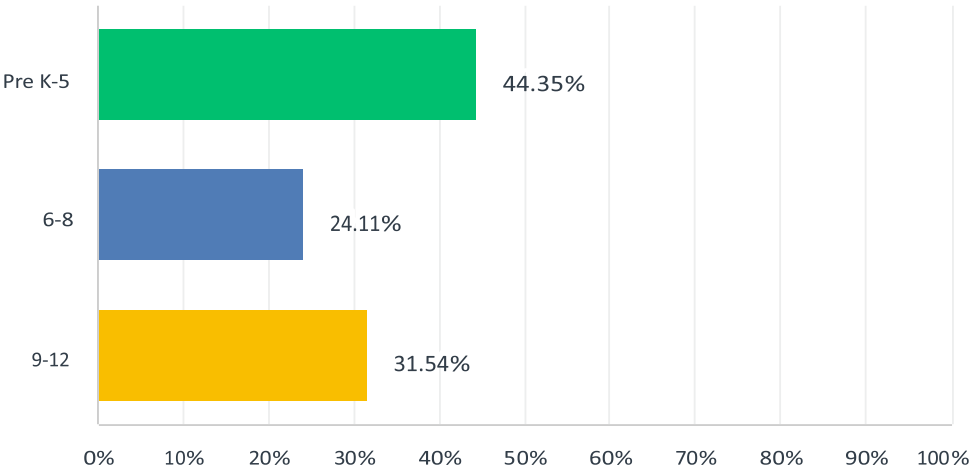

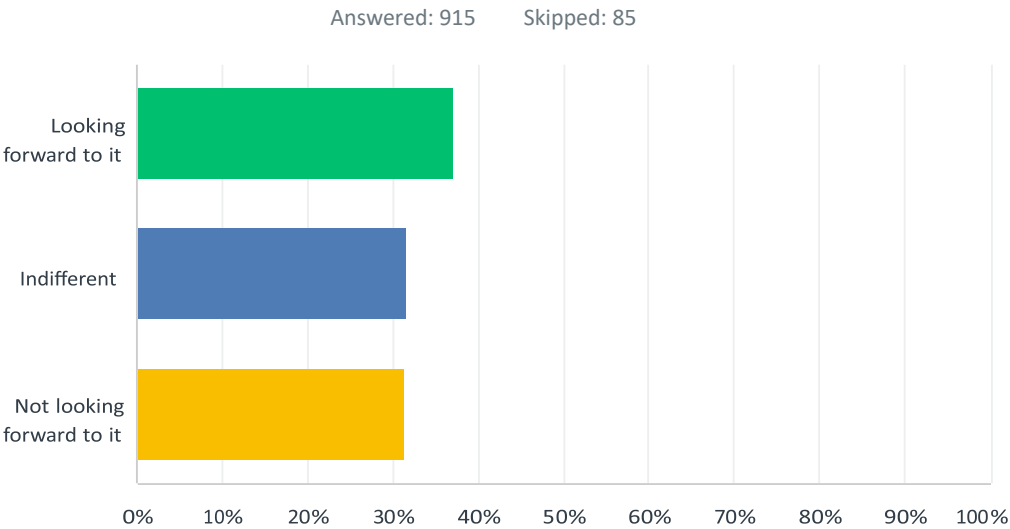
Q4 What grade level do you primarily teach?

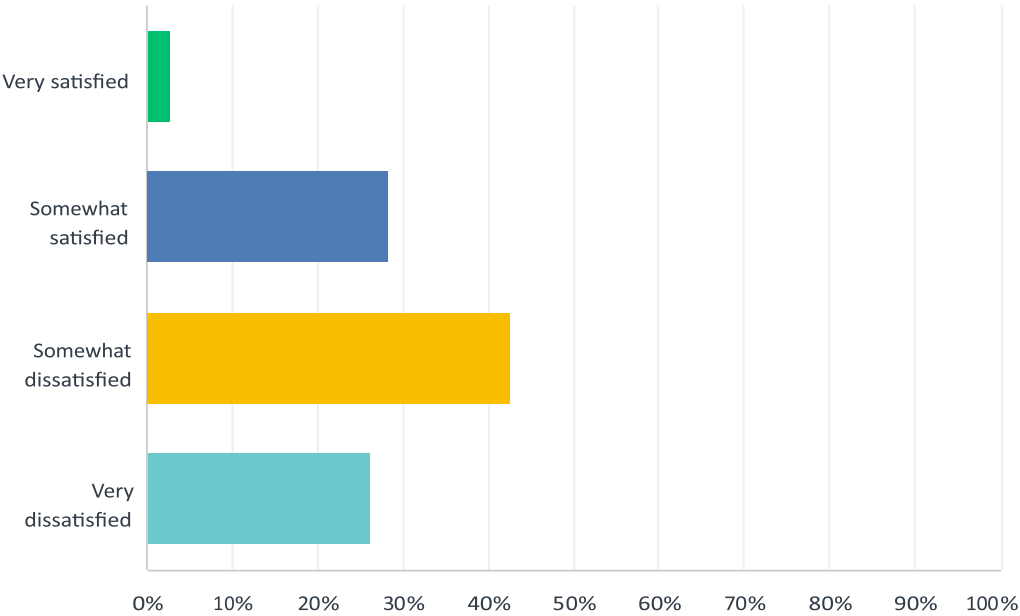
Q5 How are you feeling about heading back to school for the 2025-26 school year?

Q6 Generally speaking, how satisfied are you with conditions facing educators like you in your school district these days?

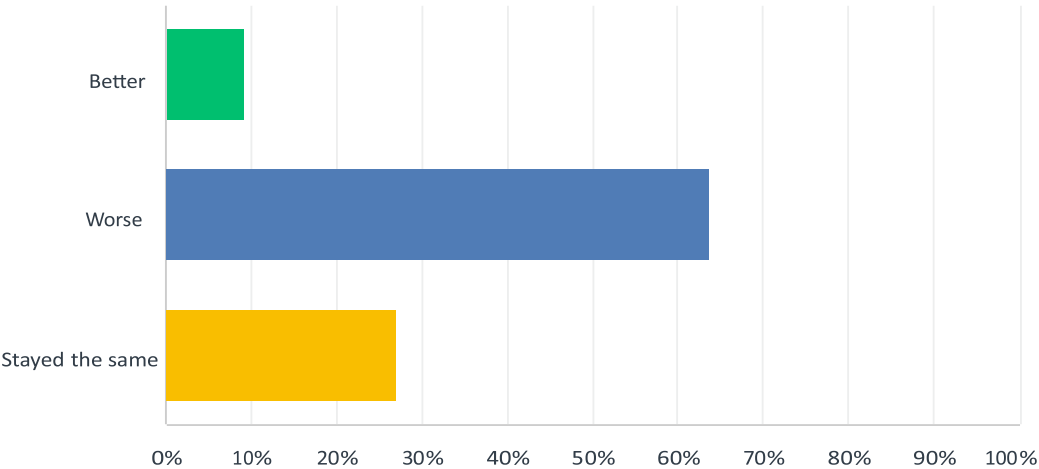

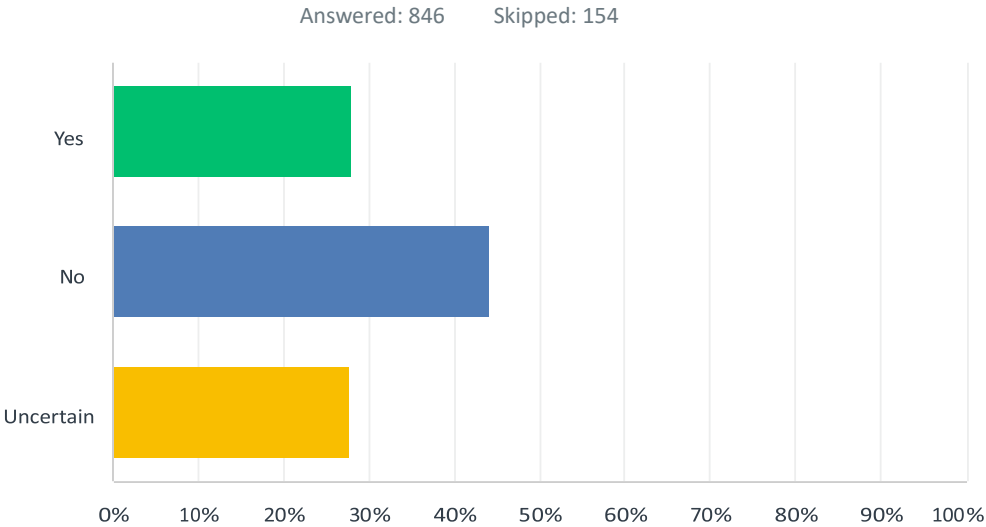

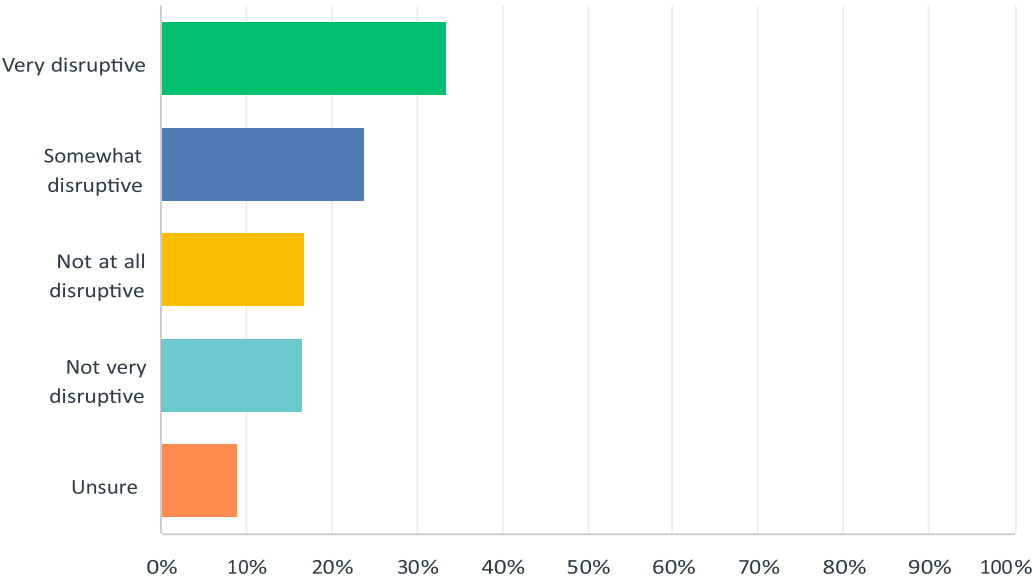

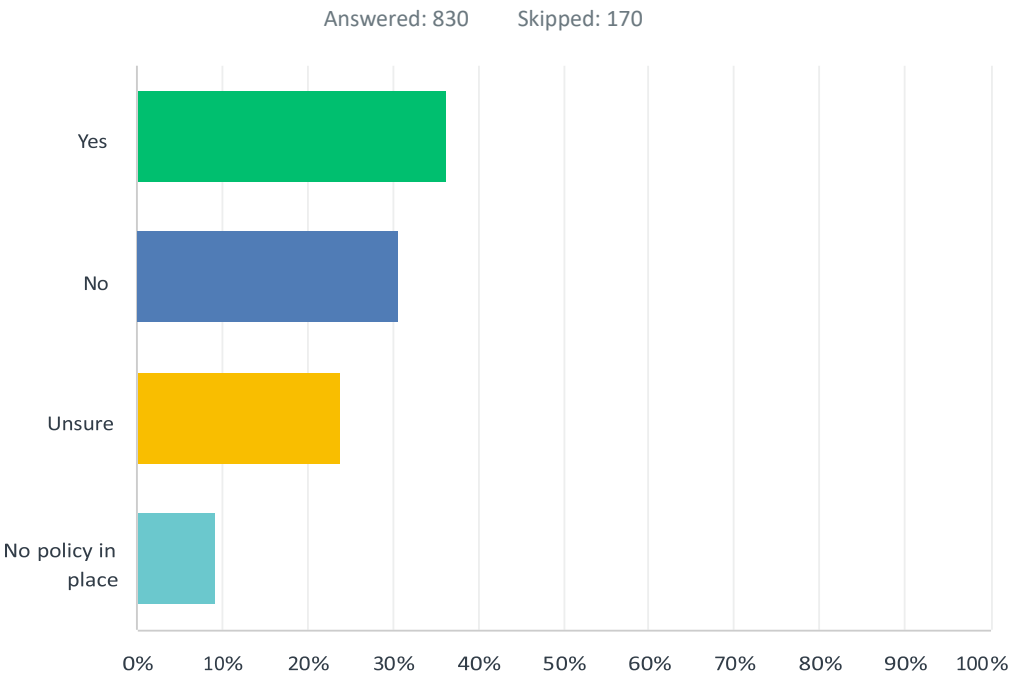

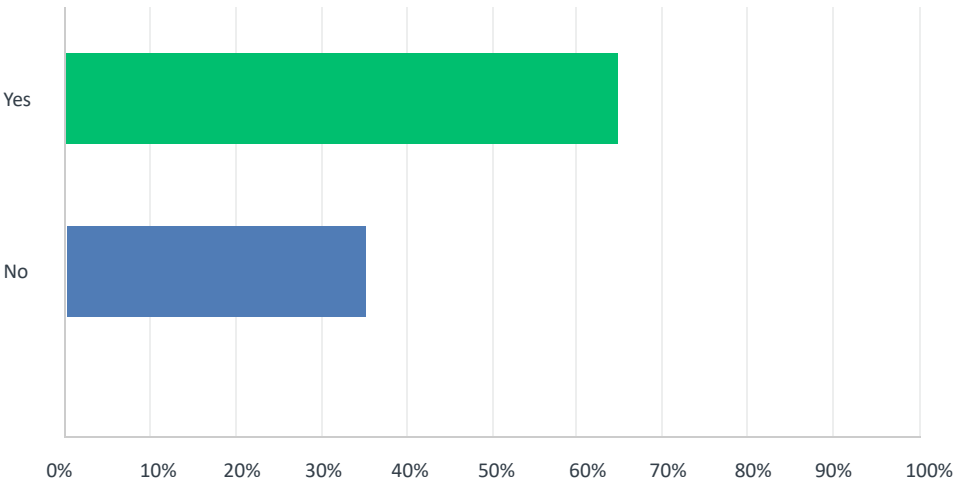
Q18 What do you believe should be done to help encourage more students to enter the profession and help retain teachers in your school district? (check all that apply.)

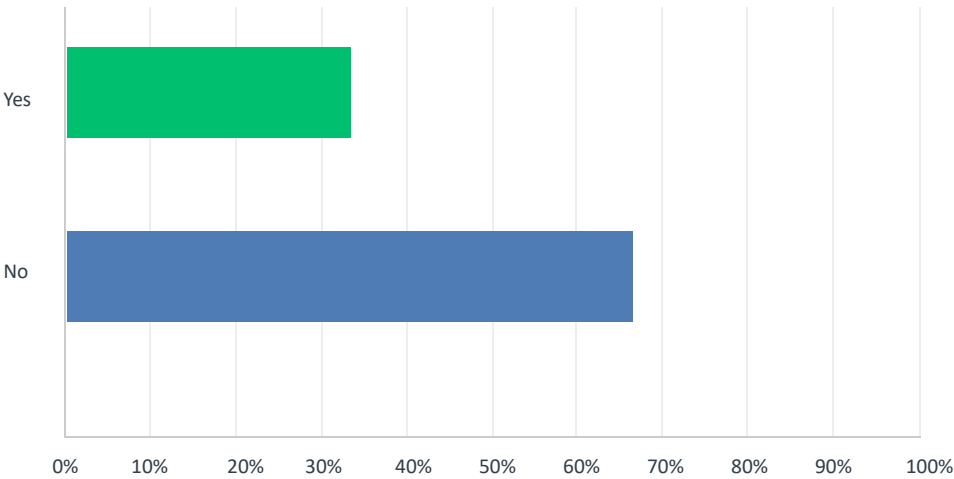

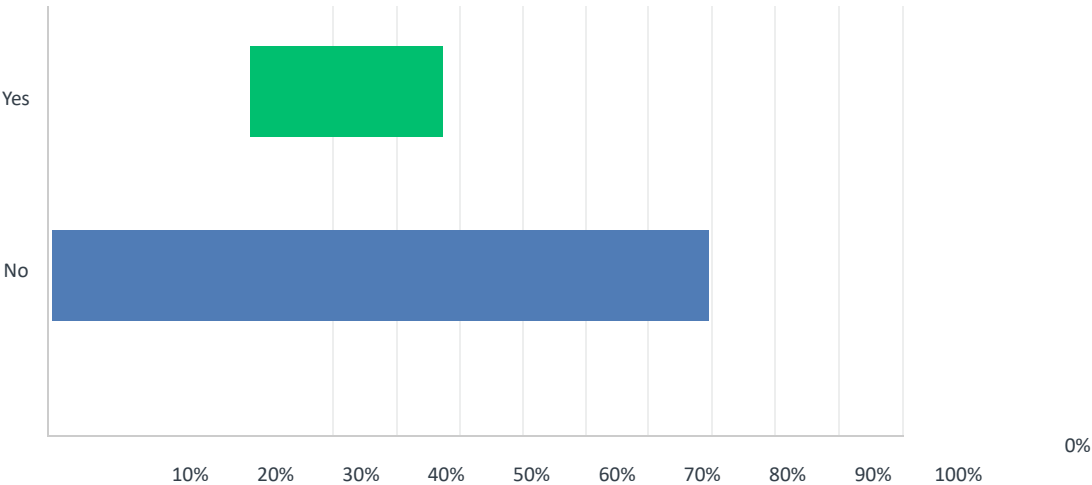

Q23 Do you feel equipped to deal with your students’ mental health challenges?

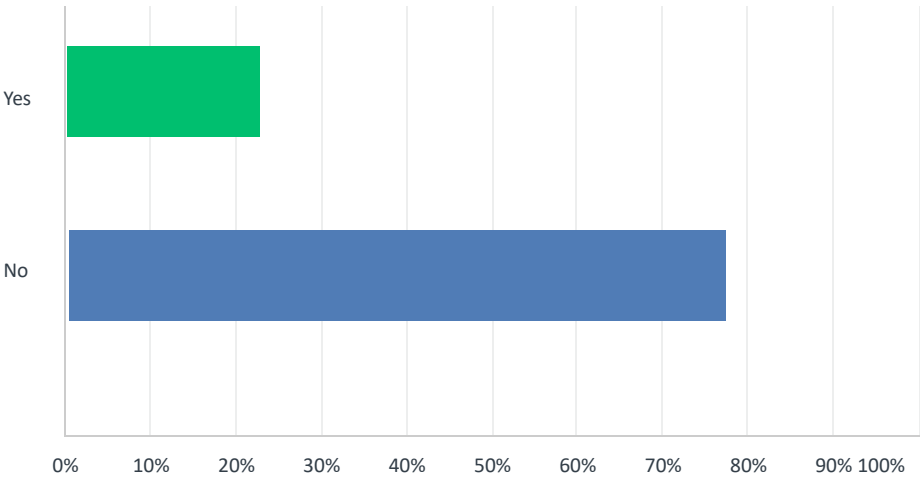

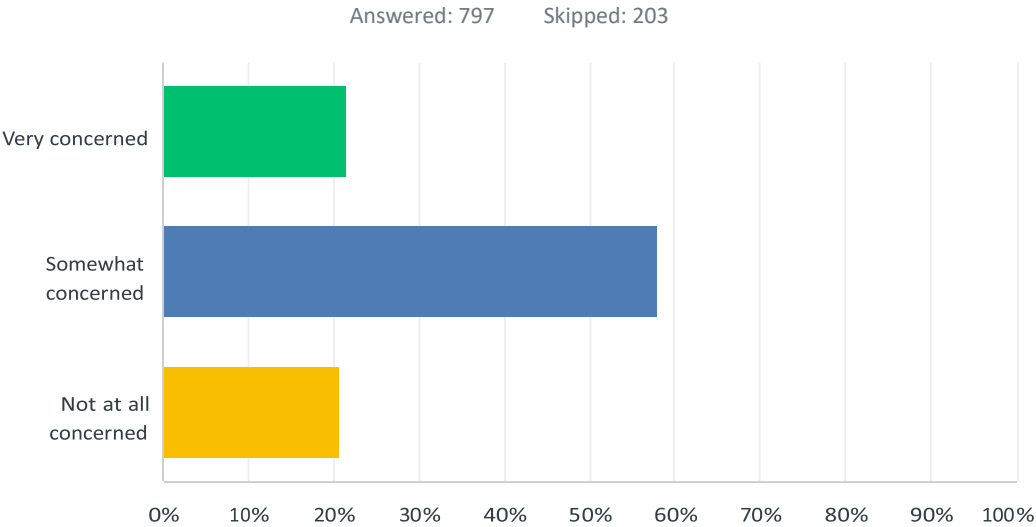

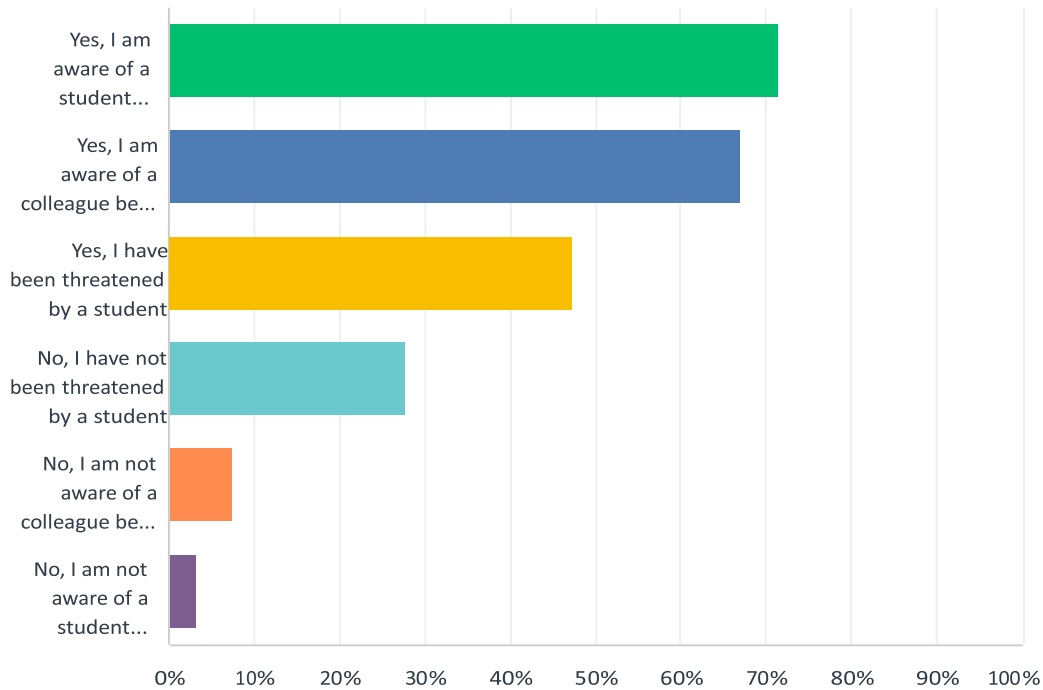
Q24 How concerned are you about your personal safety or the safety of students in your classroom due to aggressive student behavior?

Q25 Has a student ever threatened you, a colleague, or a fellow student with physical harm? (Check all that apply)

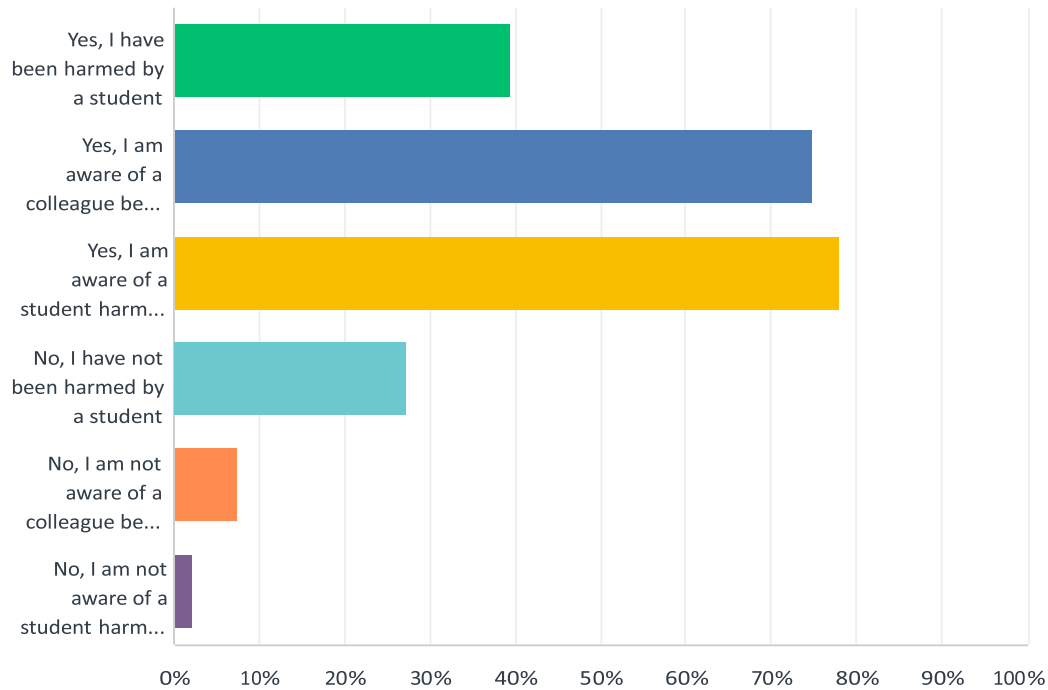

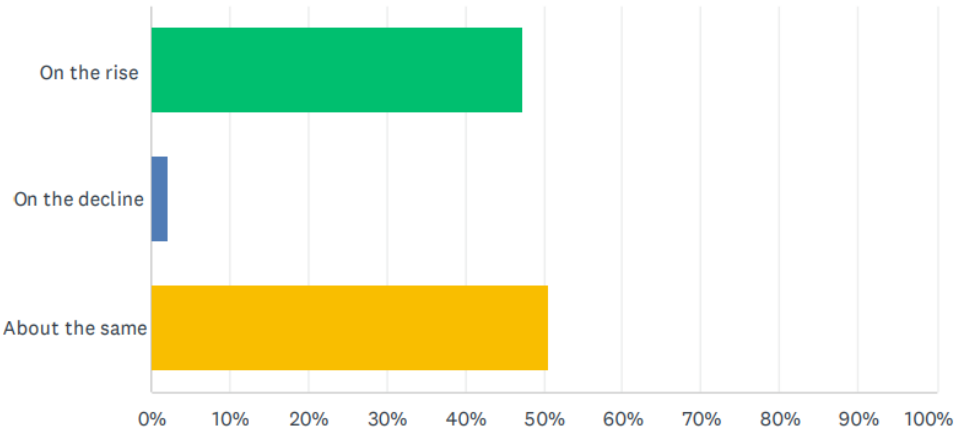

Q27 Do you believe that incidents of bullying over the past few years are on the rise, on the decline, or about the same?

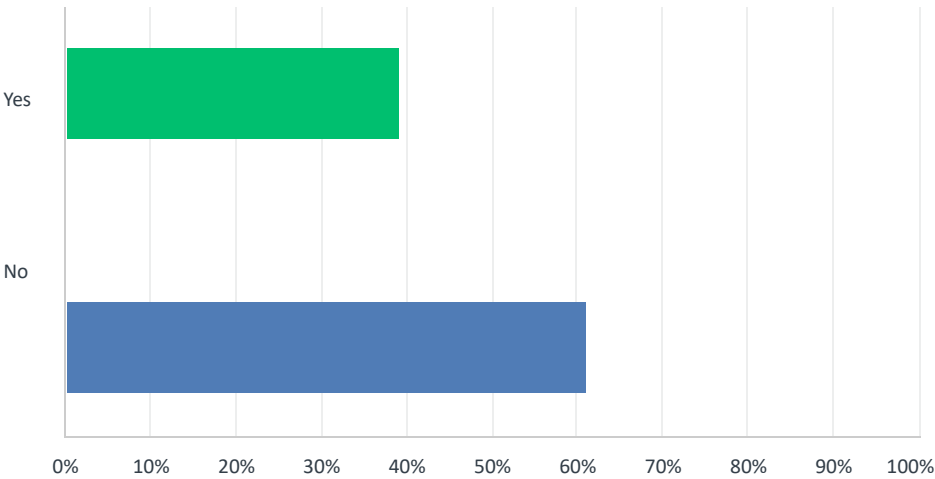

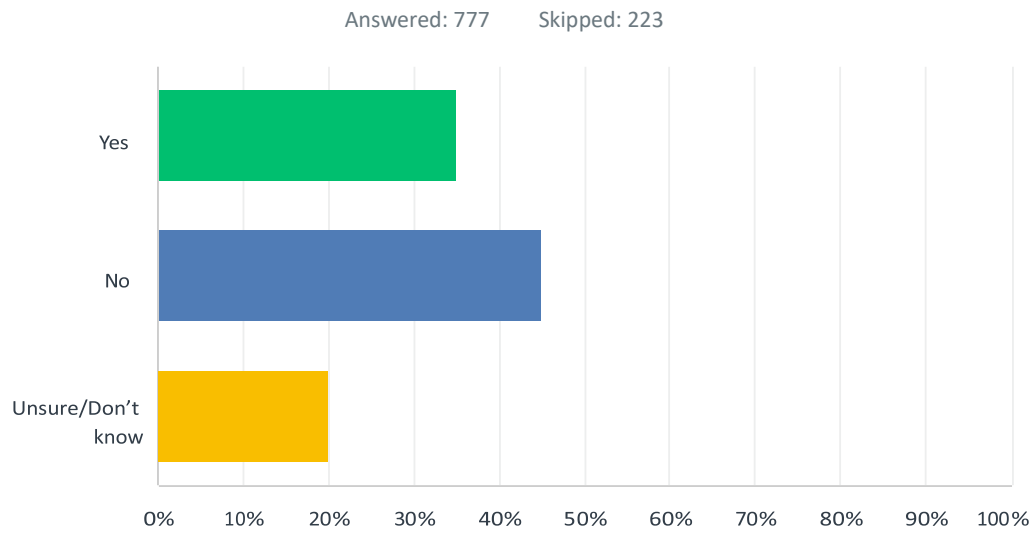
Q28 Do you believe that incidents of bullying among students in your school are being handled effectively?

Q29 Is your school district placing enough emphasis on students' social-emotional regulation?



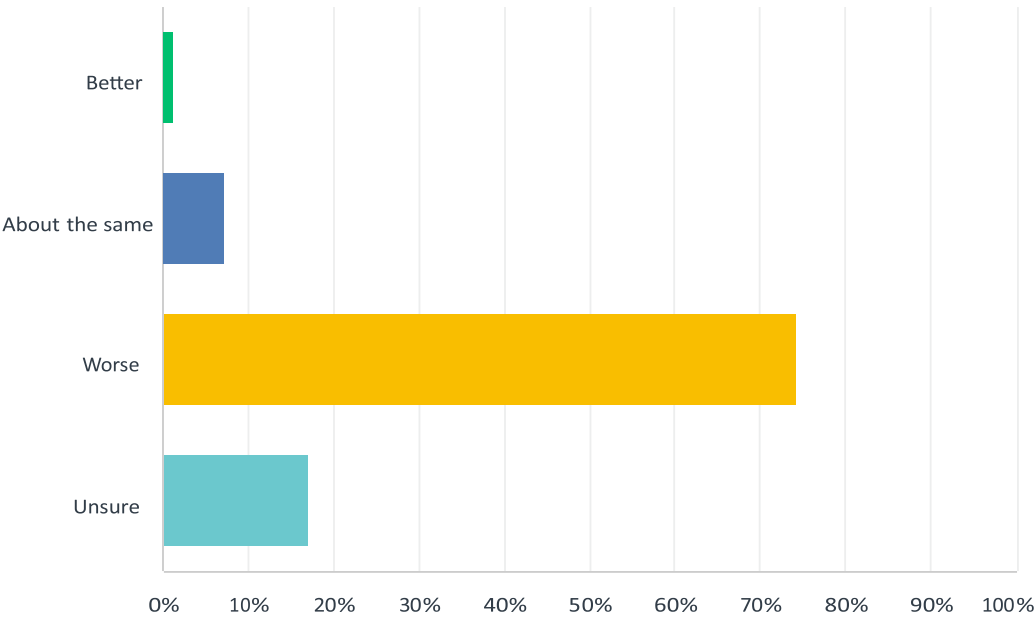

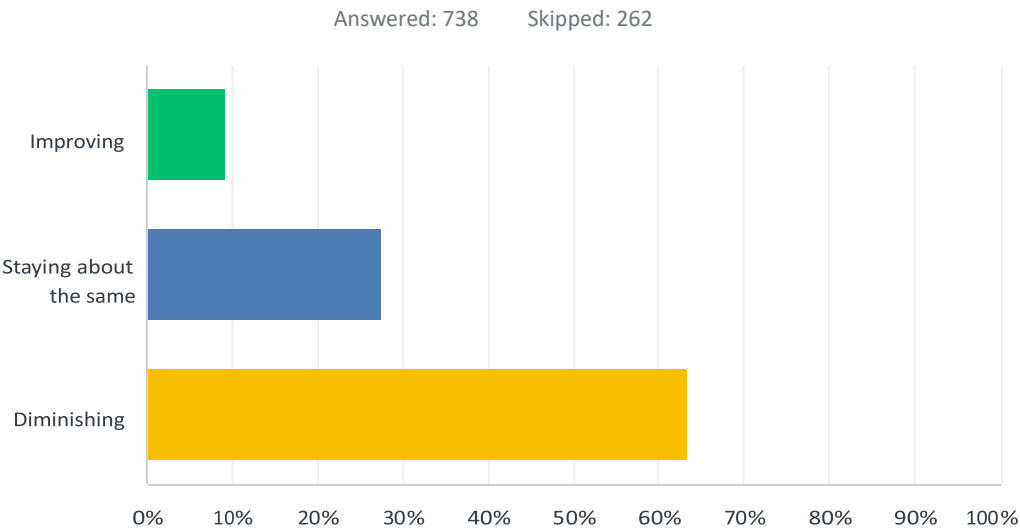
Q31 As children born during the pandemic reach school age, are the behaviors and socialization skills you see better, worse, or about the same as children who reached school age before the pandemic?

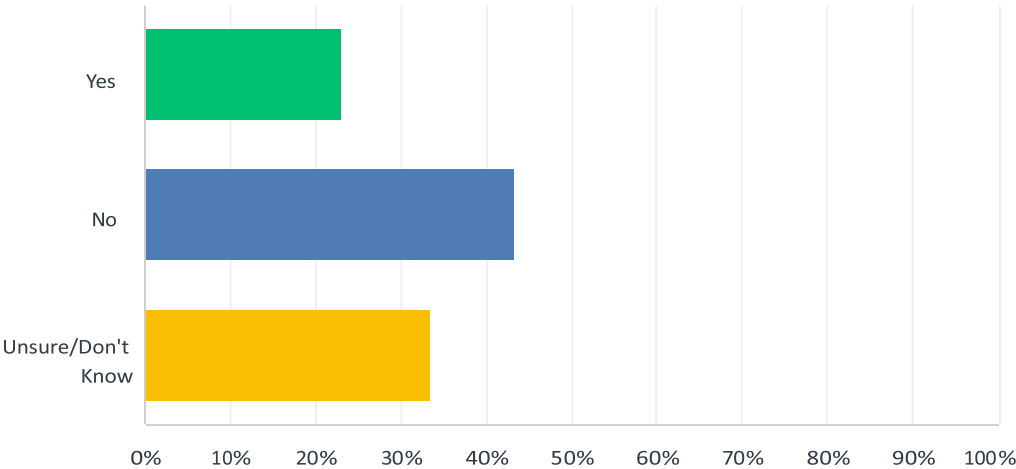

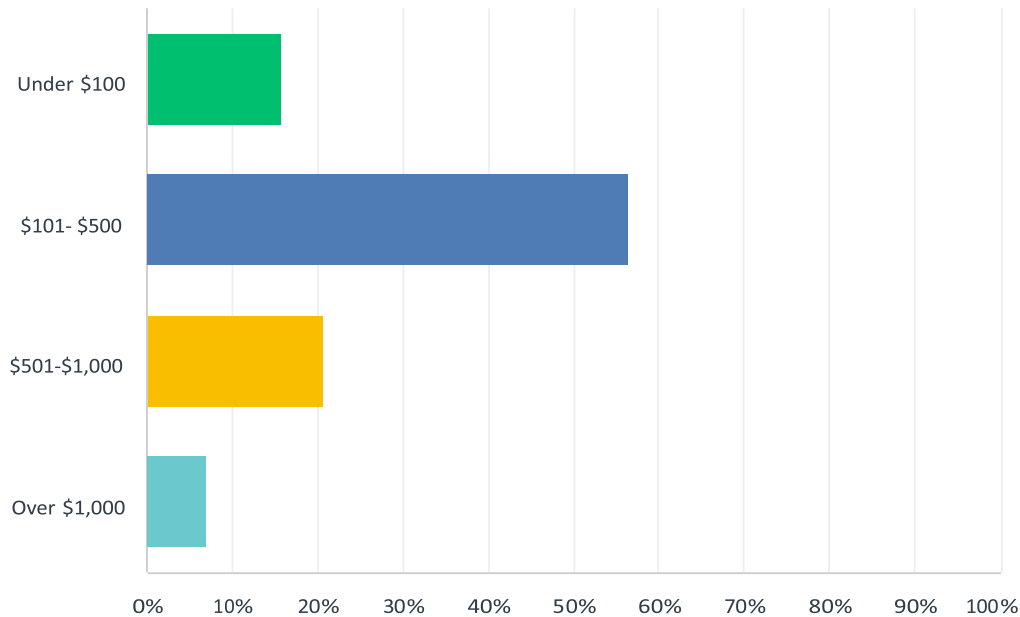

Q35 On average, how much of your own money do you spend on classroom materials, supplies, and your students on a yearly basis?

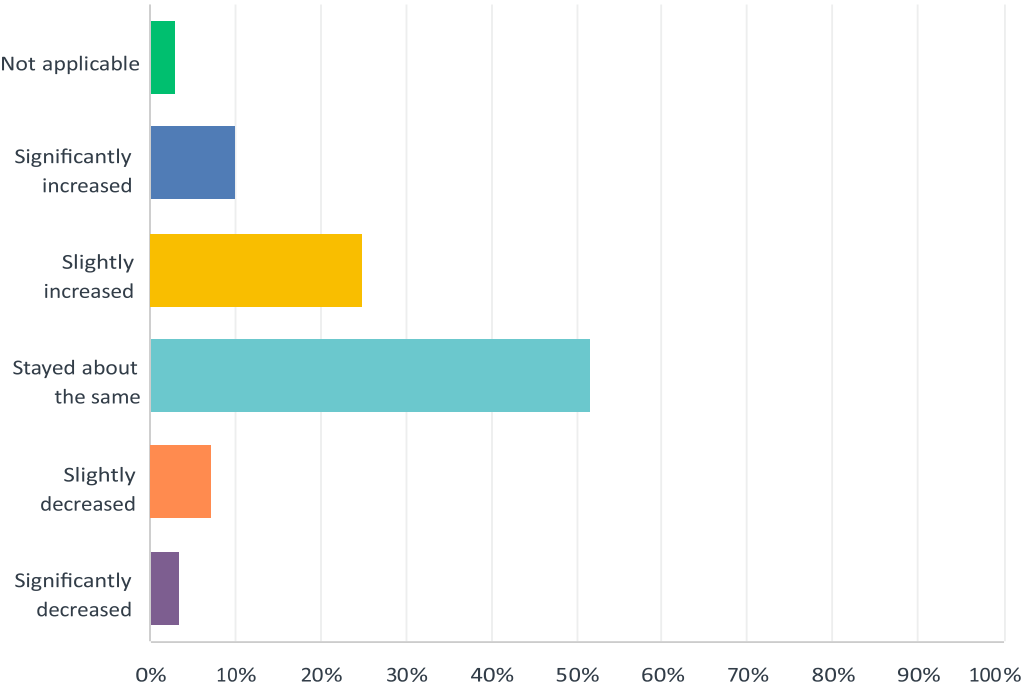

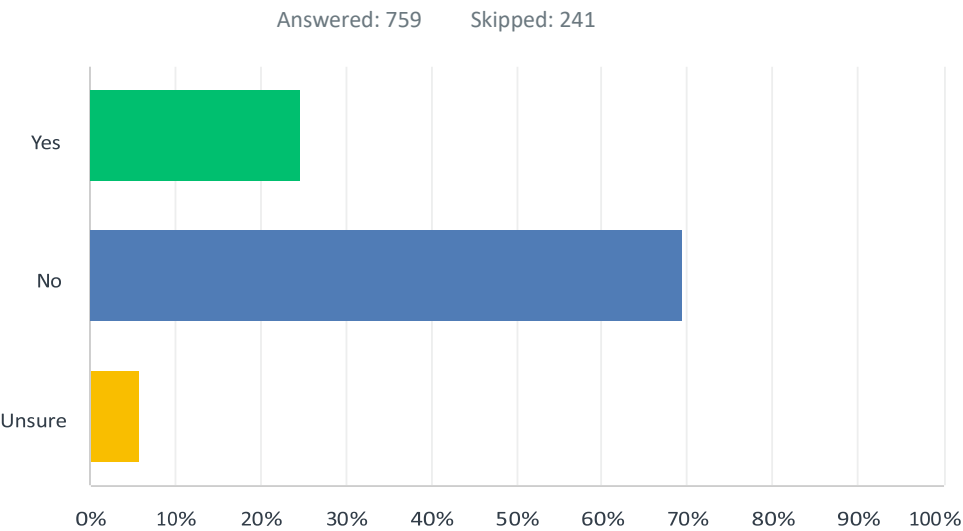

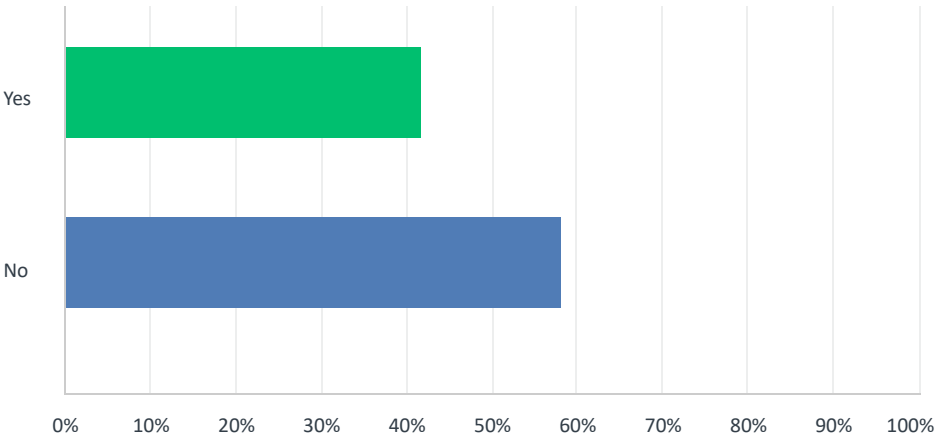
Q38 Do you consider your current salary a fair salary for your level of education?

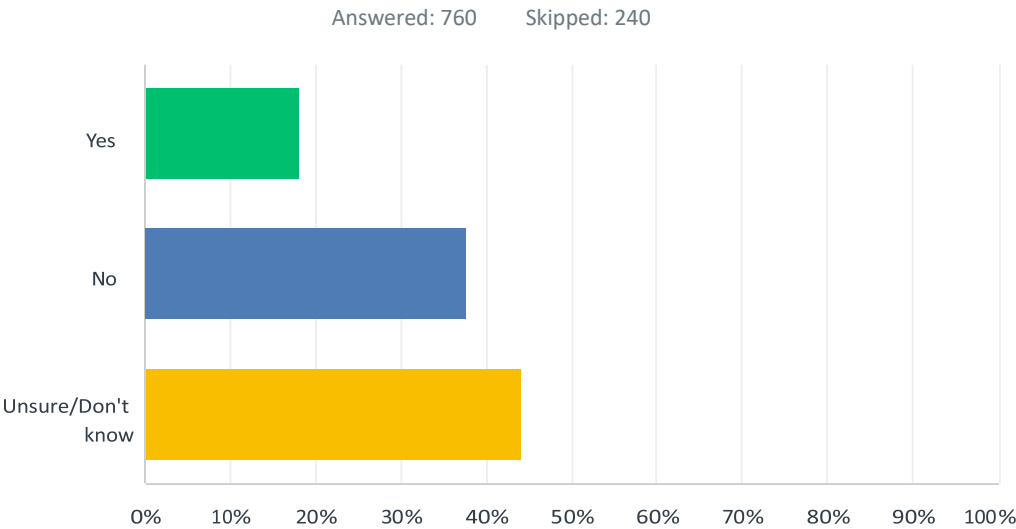

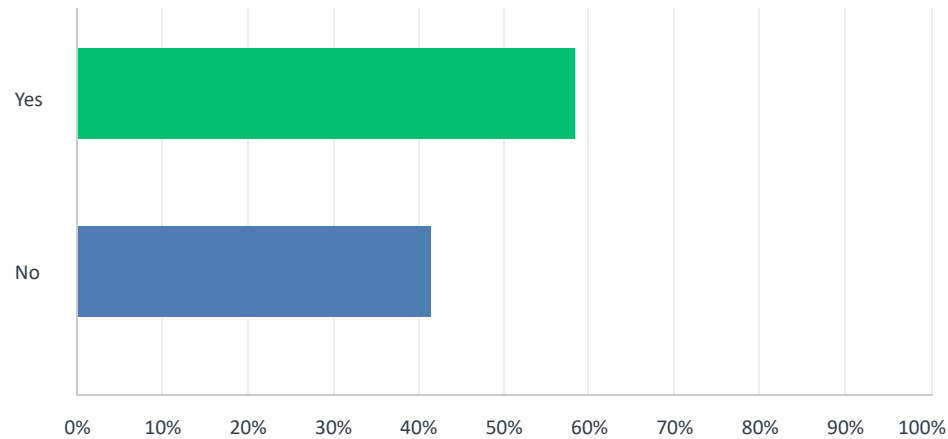
Q41 Does your school district do enough to prepare students who do not intend to enroll in college to enter the workforce?

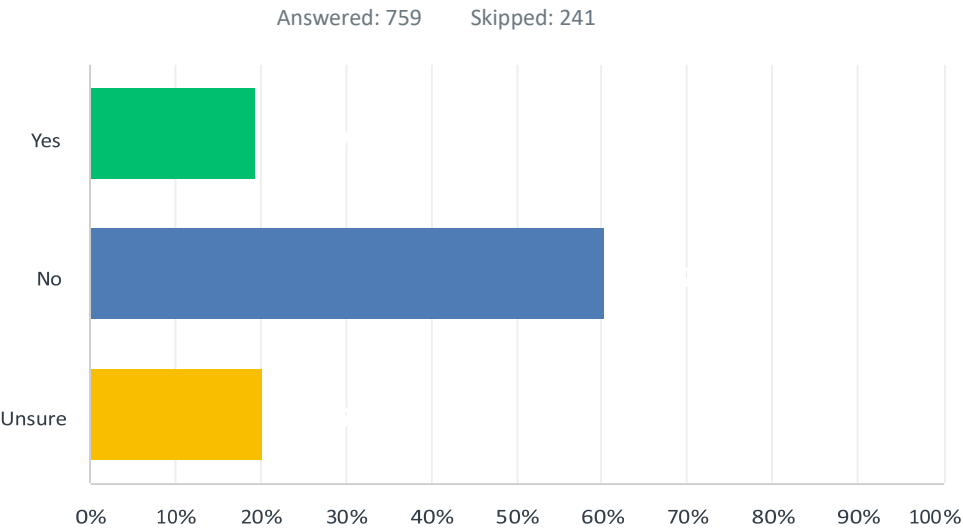
Q42 If you could do it all over again, would you choose a career as a teacher?
